8. Smokey Bear District Ranger Update

David Warnack, Ranger informed the Lincoln National Forest lifted Stage I Fire Restrictions on July 9, 2014 as a result of recent moisture. Ranger Warnack expressed appreciation for the interagency response to several small wildfires in the area. Ranger Warnack discussed plans to begin prescribed burns and informed the Ranger District would begin when the County lifted their burn ban.

Ranger Warnack provided a copy of the Standard Operating Procedures of the Lincoln National Forest for response to flooding and other All Hazard events. Ranger Warnack noted these procedures outlined the scope of capabilities as well as limitations of US Forest Service first responders.

Commissioner Doth discussed the importance of keeping the public aware of the dangers of flash flooding associated with recent rainfall.

Ranger Warnack issued an invitation to the Commissioners, County Staff and the general public to attend the Grand Opening of the newly renovated Smokey Bear Ranger District Visitors Center on August 9, 2014 in Ruidoso. Ranger Warnack stated the Ranger District would also

95 celebrate Smokey Bear's 70th Birthday and the 50th anniversary of the Wilderness Act during the
96 ceremony.

97 **9. Lincoln County Detention Center Update**

98 Nita Taylor, Manager provided statistics on monthly bookings and releases at the Lincoln
99 County Detention Center on behalf of Warden Anderson. The Detention Center reported a
100 current total average daily population of 136 and a current population of 138 prisoners
101 including 9 BIA prisoners and 0 US Marshal prisoners. The current population was composed
102 of 30 female and 108 male prisoners.
103

104 **10. Research and Development Update on the Land Development Ordinance**
105

106 Ms. Taylor reminded there was a general consensus at the March 18, 2014 meeting requesting
107 the Planning Commission consider and develop recommendations for a Land Use Ordinance.
108

109 Tom Mann, Chair of the Planning Commission presented a list of nine recommendations for an
110 ordinance governing the development of vacant tracts of land and lots within the County. Mr.
111 Mann discussed the associated costs of enactment of a Land Development Ordinance including
112 the need for permitting and enforcement staff. Mr. Mann requested the Board of
113 Commissioners consider whether or not the County would financially support the enforcement
114 portion of the proposed Ordinance before the Planning Commission proceeded. Mr. Mann
115 noted the proposed Ordinance would not necessitate the hiring of inspectors as those services
116 could continue as currently established

117 Mr. Mann commented on the current most common form of development as being approved
118 through State exemptions. Mr. Mann discussed language regarding the "disturbance of land" to
119 trigger enforcement of the proposed Ordinance. Mr. Mann also discussed the proposed
120 limitations on water well pumping. Mr. Mann stated Attorney Morel had advised the proposed
121 restrictions on water well use would require both a "critical management area" designation by
122 the State Engineer" and well metering. Mr. Mann discussed additional requirements for
123 developers to use National "Firewise" guidelines to govern vegetation on lots or tracts and a
124 requirement for access to a public roadway.

125 Commissioner Minter expressed support for a Land Development Ordinance and commented
126 permit fees might offset costs of increased staffing and enforcement. Commissioner Stone
127 expressed concern about preserving private property rights. Commissioner Stone objected to
128 the proposal to meter wells as setting a precedence which might affect agricultural water use.
129 Commissioner Stone also expressed concern about property owners having the necessary
130 technical expertise to evaluate erosion control and "Firewise" guidelines".

131 Karyl Williams, member of the Planning Commission expressed concern about the proposed
132 disturbance of 1000 square feet as a "trigger". Ms. Williams stated belief permitting
133 requirements might be detrimental to private property rights and would require associated staff
134 time for issuance and enforcement.

135 Chair Powell stated metering as a "one size fits all" action was detrimental to agricultural
136 purposes. Chair Powell favored the limitation of water well pumping to .25 acre feet per annum
137 for residential development of the 10,000 undeveloped tracts and lots. Chair Powell requested

138 additional public input be sought prior to the Board of Commissioners directing the Planning
139 Commission to proceed.

140 Mr. Mann expressed belief there was common agreement on many elements. Mr. Mann
141 suggested as an example, the revision of the "trigger" point criteria was something easily
142 accomplished.

143 Attorney Morel reminded a prior proposal for Code Enforcement was not adopted by the County
144 Commission. Attorney Morel opined if the State Engineer declared Lincoln County as a "critical
145 management area" the County could require metering. Attorney Morel discussed the various
146 potential costs associated with monitoring and compliance.

147 Commissioner Doth suggested the first consideration for development was the presence of
148 water rather than the disturbance of soil. Commissioner Doth requested additional information
149 about determining a "critical management area" and expressed belief the water issue was the
150 principal concern. Chair Powell stated she would be meeting with the State Engineer and
151 would research the question.

152 Craig Westbrook, resident of Capitan suggested the trigger might be conditioned upon a
153 particular time frame and have exclusions for certain "disturbances". Mr. Westbrook expressed
154 concern about the ability of users to read meters and the need for clarification of "Firewise
155 guidelines".

156 There was a general consensus to reconsider the proposed Land Development Ordinance at
157 the September Regular Meeting.

158 **13. 9:30 A.M.: PUBLIC COMMENT AND OTHER BUSINESS FROM COUNTY**
159 **OFFICIALS**

160 Commissioner Draper provided an update from the Southern New Mexico Economic
161 Development District meeting and informed a bylaw change to eliminate term limits of appointed
162 members was adopted. Commissioner Draper stated the NM Economic Development
163 Department had initiated a new program titled "Fund It" supporting rural economic development
164 and providing a centralized hub to assist with audit questions.

165 Commissioner Minter reported on the NMAC Worker's Compensation members meeting and
166 informed based on the last ten years of County worker's compensation claims, there would be a
167 6% increase in premiums for the County. Commissioner Minter stated there was also good
168 news for the County with a decline in claims for the last two years. Commissioner Minter stated
169 Lincoln County received a rebate check of over \$4,000 for participating in the Risk Awareness
170 Program.

171 Commissioner Minter also attend the Southeast Regional Transportation Planning Organization
172 along with Carl Palmer, Road Superintendent. Commissioner Minter discussed the
173 organization's research to assist with long range transportation planning and noted tourism
174 accounted for only 10% of the State's GDP. Commissioner Minter stated the oil and gas
175 counties which generate the most revenue also have the greatest need for road improvements
176 due to heavy truck traffic. Commissioner Minter stated the only project specific to the County
177 was a grant to Ruidoso Downs of \$128,000 for their transit system.

178 Rhonda Burrows, County Clerk reported on the NMAC Board of Directors meeting at the
179 Summer Conference. Ms. Burrows stated topics discussed were similar to those of this
180 Commission including the need for comments on the federal US Waterways proposal. Ms.
181 Burrows informed the new officers for NMAC were Paul Garcia (Mora County), President;
182 Sharon Stover (Los Alamos County), President Elect; and Clyde Ward (San Juan County), Vice
183 President.

184 Glenna Robbins, Treasurer introduced Cassie Sponagel as the newly employed Deputy
185 Treasurer. Ms. Robbins also informed Sherri Huddleston received her Treasurer's Certification
186 two years ago and her Certified Public Official designation from the NM Edge program in June
187 of this year.

188 Paul Baca, Assessor informed Rodney Zamora, Mapper Technician in the Assessor's office
189 downloaded and printed a map of the Rio Hondo Watershed for the Commissioners. Mr. Baca
190 also commented on a recent ruling by the NM Supreme Court which upheld the statutory
191 language also referred to as "tax lightening" requiring properties to be reassessed at market
192 value following a sale. Commissioner Doth questioned if there was opportunity to educate
193 realtors and the public about the property tax increases associated with a sale. Mr. Baca
194 stated realtors and others can submit a request to the Assessor's office for an estimate of
195 property taxes based on the listing price.

237 Fran Alteri, President of Carrizozo Chamber of Commerce discussed the request for \$10,000 for
238 the True Enchantment Tourism Board. Ms. Alteri stated the group applied to the State of NM for
239 a Tourism grant and requested guidance as to when the Commissioners might consider the
240 request. Ms. Alteri stated the group currently had over \$47,000 in commitments from other
241 businesses and entities. Ms. Alteri stated the group requested the \$10,000 as a match for
242 State funding

243 Commissioner Minter suggested the request be funded as recommended by the Lodger's Tax
244 Committee. Chair Powell recommended the request be reconsidered after additional Lodgers
245 Tax revenues were received.

246 **11. Water issues/Forest/Wildlife Health Programs/Land and Natural Resources**
247 **Advisory Committee (LANRAC)**

248 **4. Lincoln County and Its Long Term Commitment to Forest/Watershed Projects**
249 **Presentation – Dr. Brent Racher**
250

251 Brent Racher, PhD, representing the New Mexico Forest Industries and as a Fire
252 Ecologist, commented on the far reaching effects of wildfire and poorly functioning
253 watersheds. Dr. Racher discussed the development of Water Funds now being formed
254 in New Mexico to secure clean water for future generations.
255

256 Dr. Racher encouraged Lincoln County to make a long term financial commitment to
257 achieve forest and watershed restoration at an accelerated pace and scale. Dr. Racher
258 stated a commitment for greater than ten years was necessary to leverage local, state
259 and federal funding for wildfire and water source protection treatments. Dr. Racher
260 discussed the lack of private investment in utilizing forests products due to a lack of long
261 term supply. Dr. Racher stated the advantages of such a long term commitment
262 included creating economic opportunity by creating an ongoing reliable source supply for
263 private industry. Dr. Racher estimated a cost to the County of \$600,000 – \$800,000 per
264 year for ten years to achieve significant watershed restoration.
265

266 Commissioner Doth expressed support for the concept and commented on the costs
267 associated with the Little Bear Fire including the ongoing damage to the watershed and
268 area roads. Chair Powell stated support for the concept and suggested utilizing revenue
269 such as the Business Retention Tax for this type of project. Commissioner Stone
270 expressed concern about the effectiveness of any investment without the ability to
271 perform work on federal and state lands.
272

273 Dr. Racher stated by pledging funding over a period of years the County could better
274 compete for federal and state projects requiring matching funds. Dr. Racher also
275 discussed potential benefits to agriculture water users and noted despite disagreements
276 about water use there was general agreement the watershed was not functioning
277 properly.
278

279 Chair Powell noted the cost of cleaning debris from the Little Bear fire from Alto Lake
280 one time was \$600,000 and suggested an equivalent investment to protect the
281 watershed was appropriate. Commissioner Doth expressed support for a Business
282 Retention GRT to provide funding for this project. Attorney Morel stated he would
283 research the appropriateness of using this type of tax to fund this type of project.
284 Commissioner Draper suggested a workshop to further explore the potential investment.
285 Dr. Racher stated he did not anticipate action by the Board of Commissioners today but
286 expressed a desire for further robust discussion.
287

288 Ranger Warnack commented on the use of public funds and the need to ensure any
289 treatments were done in the areas most advantageous to the whole watershed. Ranger
290 Warnack reminded the Little Bear Fire burned across six watersheds and discussed the
291 appropriate management approach in those burn areas to provide both fire protection
292 and protect the watershed for the future. Ranger Warnack supported the idea of a
293 workshop to develop a comprehensive approach.
294

295 There was a general consensus to have the County Manager and Dr. Racher coordinate
296 and schedule a workshop to further explore the proposal.
297

298 **6. Update from South Central Mountain RC&D Forrester, Rick Merrick**
299

300 Rick Merrick, Rural Forrester discussed the work of the Planning Commission as it
301 related to "Firewise" protection. Mr. Merrick volunteered to assist with pre-inspection of
302 properties to determine needs should the Ordinance be adopted.
303

304 Mr. Merrick discussed funding associated with cost share thinning programs and stated
305 there were numerous requests from private land owners for assistance and stated site
306 inspections were beginning.
307

308 Mr. Merrick discussed the Community Forrester Program as a collaborative effort by
309 multiple agencies and noted the Bureau of Land Management recently signed on as
310 cooperating agency.
311

312 Commissioner Stone questioned if the Community Forester Program had received financial
313 support from Otero County. Mr. Merrick confirmed Otero County budgeted \$40,000 towards the
314 CFP.
315

316 **17. Consideration and Approval of a Road Review Request to abandonment and**
317 **vacate of an unnamed, unbuilt 25 foot wide road in the Angus Town Site by**
318 **Frances P. McKinney**
319

320 Robert Barber, Chair of the Road Review Committee presented information regarding the
321 request to vacate a road easement established in the 1950's. Mr. Barber noted the applicant
322 Frances P. McKinney as well as David Robinson, an adjacent land owner, were present in the
323 audience.

324
325 Mr. Barber stated the easement in question was unused and an alternate route to the west of
326 each property was established. Mr. Barber stated the Road Review Committee met to review
327 the site and to listen to the concerns of the adjacent land owner, Mr. Robinson. Mr. Barber
328 stated the Road Review Committee saw no reason as to why the road could not be vacated and
329 believed the abandonment would not cause harm to other landowners. Mr. Barber stated the
330 Robinson's expressed concern about access to their property through the easement but noted
331 their property was accessible from a different road.
332

333 David Robinson, adjacent property owner objected to the vacation of the easement as restrictive
334 to their access to the back of their property. Mr. Robinson objected to the loss of prescribed
335 access and the potential loss of property value. Mr. Robinson discussed options to remove his
336 objection to the request for vacancy including a split of the vacated property to which the
337 applicant did not agree. Mr. Robinson requested the Board either deny or delay the request
338 based on use of the easement for greater than fifteen years.
339

340 Attorney Morel questioned how Mr. Robinson maintained access over an un-built road. Mr.
341 Robinson stated there was a visible meandering road on the easement.
342

343 Attorney Morel clarified Mr. Robinson's request was to deny the vacation based on belief the
344 access exists. Attorney Morel suggested, in view of the objection to the vacation based on a
345 claim of lawful access, no action be taken today to give the parties time to reach an agreement.
346

347 **Motion:** Table the item until the next Regular Meeting, **Action:** Approve, **Moved by**
348 **Commissioner Doth, Seconded by Commissioner Stone**
349 **Vote:** Motion carried by unanimous vote (**summary:** Yes = 5).
350 **Yes:** Chair Powell, Commissioner Minter, Commissioner Stone, Commissioner Doth,
351 Commissioner Draper.
352

353 **24. Appeal of Lincoln Historic Preservation Board Decision – Ronda and Randy**
354 **Dougherty**
355

356 Attorney Morel informed an application was submitted to the Lincoln Historic Preservation Board
357 by Ronda and Randy Dougherty to erect metal fence panels on their property within the District.
358 Attorney Morel stated the Historic Preservation Board subsequently denied the request and the
359 Dougherty's wished to appeal the decision to the Board of County Commissioners.
360

361 Attorney Morel stated after meeting with Mrs. Dougherty to discuss the appeal he wished to
362 propose a resolution to allow the metal fence panels to be erected with a requirement for the
363 panels to be painted brown and covered with latillas. Attorney Morel stated if this resolution
364 was approved by the Board of County Commissioners, the County would inform all landowners
365 in the Historic District of the decision and terms to ensure equal treatment.
366

367 Attorney Morel stated the options for action as defined in the related Ordinance were to reverse
368 the ruling of the Historic Preservation Board, uphold the decision of the Board, or to make any
369 change to any requirement, determination or decision of the Board.
370

371 Ronda Dougherty stated the green panels in question were utilized by several other residents in
372 the area for various purposes. Ms. Dougherty stated the property in questions had panels in
373 place when they moved there and expressed belief these were "grandfathered in". Ms.
374 Dougherty noted the State Department of Transportation had installed a large number of the

375 panels as gates throughout the Historic District. Ms. Dougherty stated agreement with the
376 terms of the proposed resolution and informed work had begun to cover the panels with latillas.
377

378 Elaine Allen, Secretary of the Historic Preservation Board stated the prior board allowed the use
379 of green "panels" for horse pens and acknowledged the State of New Mexico Department of
380 Transportation utilized similar panels for gates but stated the Board did not allow the use of
381 panels for long stretches of fencing. Ms. Allen stated the Historic Board requested individuals
382 utilize "t" posts and other fencing as per the Ordinance. Ms. Allen stated the Dougherty's did
383 not make application prior to constructing the fence and suggested the problem may have been
384 avoided by proper application and prior discussion. Ms. Allen expressed belief the suggested
385 remedies might be inadequate to preserve the historic nature of the community.
386

387 Commissioner Stone questioned the specific language and restrictions of the Ordinance. Curt
388 Temple, Planning Director explained metal panels were prohibited by the Ordinance but stated
389 the suggestion of utilizing brown panels was a compromise. Mr. Temple discussed the
390 "grandfathering in" of panels by other properties prior to enactment of the Ordinance but stated
391 there were two other current enforcement actions as a result of other property owner's utilizing
392 panels. Commissioner Stone suggested those purchasing property in the area should be
393 prepared to comply with the Ordinance.
394

395 Attorney Morel clarified the Ordinance lists acceptable and unacceptable types of fencing but
396 does not specifically address the use of metal panels for fencing. Attorney Morel stated if the
397 compromise of painting the panels brown and adding lattias was unacceptable the Board of
398 Commissioners could set a date and time for an administrative hearing.
399

400 **Motion:** Approve the placement of panels if painted brown and covered with lattias as outlined
401 by Attorney Morel with a requirement for completion within three months, **Action:** Approve,
402 **Moved by** Commissioner Doth, **Seconded by** Commissioner Minter.
403

404 Commissioner Stone questioned if the vote would set a precedent. Attorney Morel confirmed
405 any decision would set a precedent.
406

407 **Vote:** Motion carried by unanimous vote (**summary:** Yes = 5).

408 **Yes:** Chair Powell, Commissioner Doth, Commissioner Draper, Commissioner Minter,
409 Commissioner Stone.
410

411 Attorney Morel stated the County would send letters to all property owners in the Historic District
412 to ensure uniform compliance.
413

414 11. Water issues/Forest/Wildlife Health Programs/Land and Natural Resources 415 Advisory Committee (LANRAC) – continued 416

417 1. Water Rights Notice:

418 There were no new water right notices posted to the State Engineer's website.
419

420 2. Water Rights Transfer Protests:

421 Ms. Taylor provided copy of letters received from the Office of the State Engineer which
422 identified the protestants to Transfer Applications: SD-1300-1; 1300-2; 1300-3; 826-2
423 into 9275-1 and H272 et al (t); and H-501 into 075-1 and H-272. Ms. Taylor noted the
424 State Engineer in both letters "highly recommended that the applicants attempt to

425 resolve the protestant's issues prior to the pre-hearing". Ms. Taylor discussed a request
426 submitted to the Office of the State Engineer for Chair Powell to be included in any
427 meetings with the Village of Ruidoso and for the County to receive copies of public
428 records. Ms. Taylor stated a response was received inviting the County to schedule an
429 appointment to view the public records. Ms. Taylor informed Chair Powel had initiated
430 educational meetings among the parties beginning with a field trip on June 25, 2014
431 attended by representatives for the NM Environmental Department, the Office of the
432 State Engineer, Representative Zach Cook and Manager Taylor. Ms. Taylor stated the
433 purpose of the meeting was to show the degree of impairment to the Rio Ruidoso
434 downstream in the Ruidoso and Hondo Valley.

435 Chair Powell discussed the lack of acknowledgement by the State Engineer's Office of the
436 protests lodged on transfers of water from 30 miles downstream. Chair Powell commented on
437 the inappropriateness of the State Engineer's defense in favor of actions by the Village of
438 Ruidoso rather than senior water right holders in the Hondo Valley. Chair Powell noted the
439 State of New Mexico was revising the sixteen different regional water plans at this time without
440 a lack of real public input along with a sense of disregard for agriculture. Chair Powell
441 suggested the transfer of large amounts of water from the Valley would eventually negatively
442 affect all economic development in the County.

443 There was a general consensus to seek an in person audience with Governor Martinez to
444 discuss the water issues.

445
446 **3. Community Meeting Addressing "Watersheds in the Sacramento Mountains":**

447 Ms. Taylor informed the NM Environmental Department (NMED) Surface Water Quality
448 Bureau was hosting a Community Meeting to address "Watersheds in the Sacramento
449 Mountains" on July 16, 2014. Ms. Taylor stated the primary topic was "Total Maximum
450 Daily Load" development which was described as a planning document to establish
451 specific goals to meet water quality standards in watersheds where pollutant limits are
452 exceeded. Ms. Taylor stated a 30 Day Public Comment Period opened July 7 and
453 closed on August 7, 2014.

454
455 **5. Risk Mapping, Assessment and Planning ("MAP") Program:**

456 Ms. Taylor informed FEMA in partnership the NM Department of Homeland Security and
457 Emergency Management (NMHSEM) selected the Rio Hondo Watershed for the initial
458 step in the Risk MAP process called "Discovery". Ms. Taylor stated the goal of the
459 "Discovery" was to gain a holistic picture of the flood hazard within the Rio Hondo
460 watershed, collect data to validate flood risk, identify and facilitate mitigation planning to
461 reduce flood risk.

462
463 **7. Water & Natural Resources Legislative Committee and New Mexico Finance
464 Authority Oversight Committee Joint Meeting:**

465 Ms. Taylor stated she had attended and participated in a panel discussion at the joint
466 committee meeting which addressed water and wildfire related issues.

467
468 Chair Powell recessed the Regular Meeting at 12:10:40 PM and reconvened at 1:04:20 PM.

469
470 **Absent:** Commissioner Doth.

471

472 Chair Powell recessed the Regular Meeting and convened the Public Hearing at 1:04:26 PM.

473

474 **27. 1:00 P.M. Public Hearing is to consider Final Budget FY 2014-2015**

475

477

478 Ms. Taylor explained the purpose of the Resolution as an internal measure to adjust budget line
479 items for increased revenues and to accomplish balancing for the following line items:

759 Chair Powell questioned if a request for an additional vehicle might impact the funding available
760 for construction of a new fire station. Ms. Taylor explained this request might impact the project
761 and noted no approval was yet granted by the State Fire Marshall for a vehicle purchase at this
762 time. Ms. Taylor recommended no action at this time.

763

764 **22. Consideration of Approval or Disapproval of Indigent Health Care Claims**

765

766 Scott Annala, IHC Administrator presented the Sole Community Provider/Lincoln County
767 Medical Center/Safety Net Care Provider Pool claims for approval. Mr. Annala processed 42
768 claims with 41 recommended for approval and 1 recommended for disapproval for a total
769 authorization of \$51,943. Mr. Annala stated the average monthly approval for the last fiscal
770 year was \$86,211. Mr. Annala noted all claims presented were for services in the prior fiscal
771 year.

772 Mr. Annala presented the Indigent Health Care Payments request for the month and stated he
773 processed 16 claims with 11 claims recommended for approval and 5 for disapproval for a total
774 payment this month of \$4,090. Mr. Annala reminded the average monthly indigent claims
775 payment for the past fiscal year was \$16,919.
776

777 Mr. Annala stated based on this first month's claims total he estimated an expenditure of only
778 \$49,000 for the fiscal year. Mr. Annala stated the decline in claims payment presented
779 additional opportunities to revise the Indigent Health Care Resolution to either increase provider
780 limits or increase payments for particular services. Mr. Annala stated he would be presenting
781 options to revise the Resolution in the near future.

807

808 **1. NM Department of Finance and Administration,** Local Government Division, on
809 June 19, 2014, granted approval of the interim budget approved by this Commission
810 on May 20th. The Manager stated the approval certified the use of the interim budget
811 pending approval of the final budget due to DFA by July 31, 2014.
812

813 **2. Building Construction / Maintenance Projects:**
814

815 **a) Carrizozo Senior Center:** The Manager reported a planning meeting for issuing
816 the construction RFP for the new Senior Center was scheduled for next week
817 with Architect Howard Kaplan of Wilson and Co., Dora Batista of SNMEDD, and
818 the Lincoln County Zia Senior Center staff.

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868

b) Courthouse Expansion Project: The Manager reported the project was on time and on budget. Recent actions included:

- Work by Otero County Electric to install a new power feeder for the building including installation of a new pole and underground cable for the new transformer to serve the entire campus.
- Concrete work to continue completing steps and a pad for the power disconnect.
- Installation of railing on steps.
- Interior work to install ceiling grids and lay ceramic tile.

c) Physician's Office Building: The Manager presented copy of the letter submitted at the request of the Commission on behalf of the County to support the nomination of the Physician's Office Building for an award honoring the best construction projects and the companies that designed and built them.

3. Office Space Changes / Additional Requests for Space:

The County's Rural Addressing Department, under the direction of Curt Temple, relocated from the Courthouse Annex in Carrizozo to the Sub-station in Ruidoso. The Manager stated both the Public Defender's Office and the District Attorney's Office out of Alamogordo expressed an interest in utilization of the unused office space. The Manager suggested the County may have multiple uses for the space and also discussed the potential use of the recently purchased Title Company property in Carrizozo.

4. Wattles:

The Manager received notification from New Mexico State University Seed Certification Department that the County's wattles were weed-free. The Manager furnished a copy of the Certificate of Inspection and Transit Inspection. The certification enables marketing the wattles to entities requiring the weed-free certification. The County has available approximately 1,100,000 linear feet of wattles. The Manager in consultation with Attorney Morel recommended a government to governmental agency transfer as the most appropriate venue to market wattles.

There was general consensus to direct the Manager to market and sell the wattles.

5. Lincoln County OES to Host MGT 383 Emergency Operations Plans for Rural Jurisdictions:

Emergency Operations Plans for Rural Jurisdictions is an eight-hour, management and planning level, instructor-led course designed to provide emergency managers and rural first responders with the knowledge and skills to develop an emergency operations plan (EOP) for their respective jurisdictions. The course provides practical knowledge about the planning process, different types of EOP formats, and the components of each. Participants engage in scenarios designed to reinforce lessons learned, enable them to determine the best format for their particular jurisdictions, and to organize the various planning components into an EOP.

6. Update on Sole Community Provider Federal Compliance (Committee Substitute for SB268): Joint Hearing with Revenue Stabilization and Tax Committee and legislative Finance Committee:

The Manager reported she and Scott Annala, Indigent Health Care Coordinator, attended the joint hearing of interim committees on the status of the new Safety Net Care Pool and the Expanded

869 Medicare Payments. The NM Human Services Department (HSD) has received
870 applications with detailed information regarding the amount of indigent care /
871 Medicaid / Medicare services provided by each hospital. HSD is now in the process
872 of determining the total level of payment derived from County, State and Federal
873 match contributions each hospital will receive. The Manager discussed the
874 significant unrest among the County governments regarding SB268 tied to the
875 Governor's line item veto of the three-year sunset clause.
876

886 a) **Finance** – Punkin Schlarb, Finance Director informed the department continued
887 to provide documentation for the upcoming audit as requested by the auditors. Ms.
888 Schlarb stated the department was in the process of updating the 2014-2015 budget
889 for presentation at the Special Meeting July 24, 2014.
890

891 Ms. Schlarb reported on a lightning strike which disabled a hard drive on the new
892 computer network system.
893

894 c) **Planning** - Curt Temple, Planning Director reported on the move of the Rural
895 Addressing Department to the substation in Ruidoso. Mr. Temple stated the move
896 was beneficial in providing addressing in accordance with the MOU with the Village
897 of Ruidoso for permitting within the County.
898

899 Mr. Temple reported on the Joint Land Use Study Technical Committee to discuss
900 imposition of costs for the implementation of the JULS. Mr. Temple anticipated
901 implementation cost to Lincoln County to be approximately \$2500 which was equal
902 to the initial cost for development.
903

904 Mr. Temple informed the County flood plain maps were being re-delineated by the
905 contractor to correct problems with the recently adopted maps. Mr. Temple
906 explained the corrections would not necessarily affect identified flood plains but
907 would provide more detailed information.
908

909 b) **Roads** - Carl Palmer, Road Superintendent informed the Road Department
910 sponsored a class for blade operators last week which was conducted by the State
911 Highway Department.
912

913 Mr. Palmer expressed hope for the sale and distribution of wattles and reminded the
914 County had additional material stockpiled to make more wattles.
915

916 The Manager stated she would seek approval from the Commission prior to initiating the
917 making of additional wattles.
918

919 d) OES - Joe Kenmore, Director of OES provided an update on recent fires in the
920 area. Mr. Kenmore stated a storm on July 2, 2014 generated a noticeable rock slide
921 on the Bonito roadway. Mr. Kenmore informed the Road Department responded
922 immediately to clear the road. Mr. Kenmore stated on July 14, 2014 Highway 37
923 from the Bonito Lake turn off back to Highway 48 flooded with the USFS responding
924 along with the County Road Department to clear debris resulting from the burn scar
925 area.

926
927 Mr. Kenmore commented on the recent Ham Operators field day with participation
928 from almost every state to demonstrate radio capabilities in an emergency situation.
929

930 Chair Powell recessed the Regular Meeting at 3:04:24 PM and reconvened at 3:17:20 PM.
931

932 **26. Consider Authorization to Pursue Affordable Housing Plan**
933

934 Ms. Taylor informed the plan was integral to economic development and explained SNMEDD
935 was mandated to develop such a plan every five years.
936

937 Commissioner Draper commented on the definition of Affordable Housing as "not being"
938 subsidized or low income housing but rather the availability of housing for current residents.
939 Commissioner Draper stated this was an opportunity to conduct a study of housing needs in the
940 County and also to help meet future grant award requirements. Commissioner Draper stated
941 there was verbal support from the Mayors of Capitan and Ruidoso Downs to contribute to the
942 Study costs. Commissioner Draper suggested the study was an opportunity to work in
943 partnership with all of the entities in the County to conduct an extensive study of housing needs
944 and incorporate those needs into other planning efforts including water use.
945

946 Chair Powell questioned the financial commitment requested from the County. Commissioner
947 Draper stated the maximum commitment from the County would be \$10,000 depending on the
948 level of participation of other entities.
949

950 Commissioner Minter suggested housing issues were best served by nongovernmental entities.
951 Commissioner Stone questioned how the study would help rural municipalities. Commissioner
952 Draper stated the study would identify the needs of each of those communities in a legitimate
953 manner. Commissioner Minter suggested getting a commitment from each of the municipalities
954 for financial support prior to a decision. Chair Powell questioned if the County could pledge a
955 specific amount contingent upon participation by other entities. Commissioner Stone objected
956 to the timing of the request and lack of opportunity to consider the issue.

46 Chair Powell recessed the Regular Meeting and convened the Public Hearing at 8:33:20 AM.

48 **6. Continuance of Public Hearing to consider Final Budget FY 2014-2014**

49
50 **A. Resolution 2014-4 - Adopt Final Budget FY 2014-2015**

51
52 Nita Taylor, County Manager presented changes in revenue and expenditures since consideration
53 of the Preliminary Budget.

54
55 Glenna Robbins, Treasurer presented a chart detailing the history of General Fund revenues and
56 expenditures yearly from 1990-1991 to 2013-2014. Ms. Robbins reminded the figures presented
57 were based on actual revenues and expenditures not on budgeted revenues and expenditures.
58

59 Ms. Taylor pointed out expenditures during several years, including 2013-2014 where
60 substantially greater than other years. Ms. Taylor stated the County's completion of major
61 projects in these years such as the FY 2013-2014 expansion of the court complex and sheriff's
62 office accounted for the charted increased expenditures.
63

64 Ms. Taylor reminded the County was required to maintain a budget reserve of 3/12th or
65 \$1,873,473. Ms. Taylor stated the budget as presented would yield \$1,384,061 over the required
66 reserve of 3/12th.
67

68 Ms. Taylor provided a list of internal County requests previously approved and also a list of
69 additional budget items for consideration as follows:

87 Ms. Taylor stated approval of all requests as presented would result in a deficit of - \$147,034 in
88 the required amount over reserve. Ms. Taylor requested the Commission consider this and
89 reduce or not approve some of the requests.
90

91 Al Santos, Administrator of Lincoln County Medical Center presented the budget request for the
92 hospital. Mr. Santos presented the request and expressed a desire to maintain a historical
93 balance in funding for uncompensated care of 47% to be offset by County funding utilized to
94 obtain matching Federal funding. Mr. Santos stated Presbyterian would absorb 53% of the
95 projected uncompensated care costs.
96

97 Mr. Santos provided a breakdown of anticipated revenues from mill levy revenues and the hospital
98 lease with total estimated revenues of \$4,100,000. Mr. Santos enumerated the expenses related

99 to LCMC's budget request as \$859,710 for Clinic/EMS operations, \$150,000 for LCAP, \$414,226
100 for the Safety Net Care Pool match, and \$1,375,500 for Hospital operations for a total estimated
101 expense of \$2,799,536. Mr. Santos maintained the full funding of his request would leave a
102 balance of \$1,300,564 for future capital outlay projects. Mr. Santos discussed at length the
103 change from Sole Community Provider program to the Safety Net Care Pool and expressed a
104 desire to maintain or increase the level of financial support from the County offsetting
105 uncompensated care costs.

106
107 Mr. Santos noted recommendations presented by the County Manager for a reduced amount of
108 funding pending actual reporting by LCMC of uncompensated care to the State of New Mexico.
109 Mr. Santos suggested a compromise by a current approval of six months of funding or ½ of the
110 requested \$2,799,536 to allow time for additional planning.

111
112 Chair Powell recessed the Public Hearing at 9:54:35 AM and reconvened at 10:09:53 AM.

113
114 Gary Mitchell, Chair of the Hospital Board commented on the County Manager's Analysis of the
115 budget request for LCMC. Mr. Mitchell stated for 35 years the Commission had adopted the
116 recommendations of the Hospital Board except for one year which resulted in a deficit for LCMC.
117 Mr. Mitchell stated should the full request not be funded, LCMC would incur a deficit for the second
118 year in a row which would result in a reduction of services or a layoff of employees. Mr. Mitchell
119 discussed the need to have an operational margin of at least 3%. Mr. Mitchell stated belief the
120 County should fund the full request not just a partial request. Mr. Mitchell reminded although the
121 voters approved a Mill Levy of 3.0, the County has never assessed the full amount.

122
123 Commissioner Minter questioned the definition and use of the term "margin" over expenses. Mr.
124 Santos stated based on the budget request presented there was an anticipated margin of 3.2%
125 or \$1.5 million. Mr. Santos stated any funds retained were utilized for facility equipment or
126 retained for future capital improvement projects.

127
128 Ms. Taylor discussed the prior approval of the clinic requests during the preliminary budget
129 process and reminded the initial hospital request of \$2,277,726 was tabled for further information.
130 Ms. Taylor discussed the State requirement for each County to contribute 1/12th or \$414,226 as
131 being a separate obligation but noted it was included in LCMC's current request. Ms. Taylor
132 stated based on information provided by Mr. Santos and the State of New Mexico, LCMC was
133 anticipated to receive \$2.3 million in Safety Net Care Pool funding and \$875,000 in a Medicaid
134 base rate increase.

135
136 Ms. Taylor pointed out LCMC had not requested operational funds in prior years and stated the
137 funding "options" she presented were designed around various amounts of operational expenses
138 with other requests being constant. Ms. Taylor noted on the analysis an associated anticipated
139 margin for each option ranging from -.30% to 3.2% for full funding. Ms. Taylor stated for budgeting
140 purposes the County historically relied on mill levy funding without inclusion of the lease payment.
141 Ms. Taylor stated if the anticipated Safety Net Care Pool funding and base rate increased funding
142 were added to any of the less than fully funded options, LCMC would still receive funding greater
143 than historically provided.

144
145 Ms. Taylor stated Federal and State Legislation provided rules for the appropriate funding of
146 uncompensated care under which the County would meet their obligation for those services by
147 pledging an amount equivalent to 1/12th GRT. Ms. Taylor informed Lincoln County was the only
148 County providing additional funding during the transition of the SCP program last year and stated
149 a poll of other counties indicated no other County planned to fund their hospital over and above

150 the State requirement. Ms. Taylor presented a separate request from the State for Lincoln County
151 to contribute \$193,503 in additional funding for SCP program disbursements for FY 2013-2014.
152 Ms. Taylor reminded the County approved \$1 million in additional funding for LCMC in FY 2013-
153 2014 to cover the gap in SCP funding and therefore did not recommend approval of this additional
154 payment.
155

156 Ms. Taylor agreed with Mr. Santos on the potential for a midyear budget adjustment based on
157 additional information about Safety Net Care Pool disbursements and other State funding at that
158 time. Mr. Santos agreed but requested approval of the full funding request rather than a reduced
159 amount at this time.
160

161 Chair Powell adjourned the public hearing reconvened the Regular Session at 11:29:00 AM.
162

234 Ms. Taylor provided a summary of proposed ICIP projects for consideration. Ms. Taylor stated
235 after projects were prioritized today, she would research estimated costs for completion of
236 various projects. Ms. Taylor reminded a capital outlay request for funding was more likely awarded
237 if a design plan was funded and completed prior to any request to the State Legislature.

238
239 Ms. Taylor reported an increased estimated cost for a new County Road Yard of approximately
240 \$1.3 million. Ms. Taylor discussed the inclusion of the New Horizons Center on the County's
241 ICIP plan as a recommendation by Hubert Quintana of SNMEDD. Ms. Taylor reminded the
242 County owned the building which housed New Horizons.

243
244 Chair Powell suggested the new Hondo Fire Station be prioritized and submitted as a single
245 request. Commissioner Stone reminded of the problem of insufficient space to house vehicles
246 at the White Oaks Fire Station. There was a general consensus to list the White Oaks Fire
247 Station as the second priority. Commissioner Doth reminded of the previous year's Capital Outlay
248 award of \$125,000 for the expansion of the Detention Center. Chair Powell suggested the award
249 be utilized for design of the expansion this fiscal year and the actual cost of expansion of the
250 Detention Center be prioritized as the top ICIP priority in the next fiscal year.






**Smokey Bear RD, Lincoln National Forest, Briefing Paper for
Lincoln County Commissioners Meeting
August, 2014**

Critical Updates

- Our ranger district recently worked with South Central Mountain RC&D and the Upper Hondo Soil and Water Conservation District, to write a grant proposal to perform stream channel work at the South Fork of Bonito Creek bridge. The proposal was submitted to the New Mexico Environment Department as part of the "River Stewardship Program." Adjacent projects also included work within Walt Smith Canyon, South Fork Campground and noxious weed treatments. Proposals were due on July 30th, and grant awards are anticipated by the end of August.
- Our ranger district completed approximately 1,200 acres of prescribed burning in July. We have attempted to continue burning in August, but conditions have been too wet to proceed. We will continue to monitor fuel moistures and will take advantage of optimum conditions when things dry out a bit.
- Forest Plan Revision – In October, the Lincoln National Forest will begin a process to revise our Forest Plan, which was first published in 1987. The National Forest Management Act (NFMA) of 1976 requires every national forest or grassland managed by the Forest Service to develop and maintain an effective Land Management Plan (also known as a Forest Plan).
 - The process for the development and revision of plans, along with the required content of plans, is outlined in planning regulations, often referred to as the planning rule (the 2012 Planning Rule is the current rule). Managers of individual forests and grasslands follow the direction of the planning rule to develop a land management plan specific to their unit.
 - I am looking forward to this project because the 1987 Forest Plan that we are currently working with is out of date and no longer addresses the needs of our ranger district and communities.
 - In the coming months, you will hear more about the Lincoln's approach to Forest Plan Revision, and how the Lincoln County Commission can be involved in the process.

Sole Community Provider/SNCP Payments: This month our coordinator processed fifteen (15) claims, all of which are recommended for approval. If approved, the total recommended payment this month is \$11,400.08. See Enclosure. 1.

Indigent Health Care Claims: This month our coordinator processed twelve (12) claims. Ten (10) are recommended for approval, and two (2) for disapproval for the reason indicated at Enclosure 2. If approved, total recommended for payment this month is \$15,294.18. At Enclosure 2 is a summary of total applications approved and denied. At Enclosure 3 is the summary of the Indigent Fund Meeting for August and the Year-To-Date that each lists the applications by provider.

Manager's Analysis – For the last two years, the average Indigent Health Care monthly payments were \$24,262 and \$16,919 respectively. The FY 13-14 year-end total was \$203,029.23. Our budget for FY14 – 15 is \$393,278. To date, the total expenditure is \$19,384.09 or an average of \$9692.05 monthly.

Similarly, for the last two fiscal years, the total Commission-approved Sole Community Provider Claims were \$1,371,890 and \$1,034,535 respectively. The FY 13 - 14 monthly average was \$86,211. To date, the total authorization is \$63,343.

Recommendation: Approve the claims as indicated for the Sole Community Provider/SNCP report at Enclosure 1 and approve and disapprove the Indigent Health Care Program report as indicated at Enclosure 2.

WHEREAS, New Mexico counties care greatly about health care for their local citizens and value their local hospitals, particularly in rural areas; and

WHEREAS, counties have long played an integral role in providing health care services for their indigent residents; and

WHEREAS, for nearly 20 years counties have worked collaboratively with their local community hospitals in helping fund the Sole Community Provider program and in coordinating health care for their local citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Sole Community Provider program has now been replaced by the Safety Net Care Pool (SNCP), which provides funding for community hospitals for Medicaid base rate increases and uncompensated care for Medicaid patients; and

WHEREAS, the counties' role under the SNCP has been significantly diminished and their financial contribution to the SNCP no longer has any relationship to the funds disseminated by the Human Services Department (HSD) to the counties' respective community hospitals; and

WHEREAS, information provided by HSD regarding the SNCP has been confusing and often contradictory, and the distribution formula to community hospitals has been inequitable and difficult to ascertain; and

WHEREAS, finding a solution to funding the SNCP requires communication and cooperation among the various stakeholders—counties, hospitals, and the state, in both the legislative and executive branches; and

WHEREAS, the SNCP is part of the federal Medicaid program, and is therefore a state responsibility that should be fully funded by the state; and

WHEREAS, SB268, as passed by the legislature in 2014, required most counties to contribute the equivalent of a 1/12th % gross receipts tax (grt) increment to the SNCP, and was intended to be a three-year interim solution for funding that program; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's line item veto of the three-year limitation on county funding of SCNCP will result in unlimited long term county financial responsibility for the program that will ultimately cost the counties hundreds of millions of dollars; and

WHEREAS, that long term county financial responsibility was neither authorized nor intended by the legislature in SB 268.

AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
THE COUNTY OF LINCOLN
AND
THE LINCOLN COUNTY DEPUTY SHERIFFS' ASSOCIATION

SECTION 1. PARTIES TO THE AGREEMENT.

- A. This Agreement is entered into by and between the County of Lincoln, hereinafter referred to as the "County", and the Lincoln County Deputy Sheriffs' Association, hereinafter referred to as the "Association."
- B. The County of Lincoln recognizes the Lincoln County Deputy Sheriffs' Association as the exclusive collective bargaining representative for the regular full-time non-probationary, non-supervisory, non-confidential sworn officers of the Lincoln County Sheriffs' Department.
- C. The parties shall not discriminate against any member of the bargaining unit based on race, color, sex, creed, religion, age, national origin, membership or non-membership in the Association.
- D. For the purposes of this agreement and any subsequent Memorandum of Understanding, Lincoln County shall be referred to as the County; the Lincoln County Sheriffs' Department shall be referred to as the Department; the Sheriff shall be referred to as the Sheriff; the Lincoln County Deputy Sheriffs' Association shall be referred to as the Association, and any reference to Deputy shall be referred to as employee.

SECTION 2. ASSOCIATION REPRESENTATIVE.

The Association and the County will attempt to resolve issues and grievances in an atmosphere of professionalism and mutual respect. Should the Association president need to conduct Association business during normal working hours the president will be allowed, subject to staffing requirements, to request the use of accrued comp time, annual leave, or leave without pay. If the assistance of the Association President or designee is requested by the County in the resolution of a labor/management relations problem and the problem is handled during the president's or designee's regular work time such time will be on paid status.

SECTION 3. SEXUAL HARASSMENT.

The parties agree and recognize that sexual harassment is a violation of County regulations, state law and federal law, is demeaning to employees subjected to such conditions and is destructive to the work environment. Unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature shall constitute sexual harassment. Sexual harassment by any employee, representative or other person who works subject to the control of either party is forbidden. The parties will abide by all appropriate rules, regulations, and laws prohibiting sexual harassment.

SECTION 4. LEAVE TO VOTE.

Employees who are registered and eligible to vote will be scheduled and allowed time to vote as required by state law. Such time may not be used for any other purpose. The County may verify if the time was used to vote.

SECTION 5. MATERNITY LEAVE.

Maternity leave will be handled in accordance with the Family Medical Leave Act.

SECTION 6. MILITARY LEAVE.

If an employee is or becomes a member of any component of the United States Armed Forces or the New Mexico National Guard they will be granted military leave in accordance with state or federal laws.

SECTION 7. LEAVES OF ABSENCE WITHOUT PAY.

When a regular full-time employee has demonstrated a need for time off the County Manager may grant a regular employee leave without pay for a period not to exceed one (1) year.

During such leaves, the employee's position may be filled by another employee. At the expiration of a leave without pay, the employee may be reinstated in the position vacated. If not reinstated to the same position, the employee may be offered another vacant position provided he/she is qualified to perform the work. If there are no positions available, the employee shall be on layoff status with recall rights. Approved leave without pay shall not constitute a break in service but all time off in excess of thirty (30) days will not be counted as seniority.

The employee must provide a written notice of his/her desire to return to work at least two weeks prior to the expiration date of the leave without pay. Failure to provide such notice may be cause for refusal to reinstate or terminate the employee. This applies to leaves of thirty (30) days or more.

SECTION 8. EMPLOYEE SAFETY AND HEALTH.

The parties believe that the safety and health of the employees are of prime considerations in every phase of their activities. The parties are concerned for the human value of life, health and physical well being, and they are convinced that good safety and health practices are essential to the efficient delivery of service to the public.

The parties and the employees will work toward providing and maintaining safe and healthful working conditions. The parties will instill in the employees an awareness of the need for safe and healthful working habits. The parties will identify, report, and work toward the elimination of safety hazards in the workplace and the parties will comply with applicable health and safety laws.

SECTION 9. SICK, ANNUAL AND HOLIDAY LEAVE.

9.1 SICK LEAVE.

- A. Sick Leave is accrued at the rate of 6.67 hours per month.
- B. Sick Leave may be approved for the sickness, illness, injury or treatment of an employee. Sick Leave may also be approved as per the conditions of the FMLA for the care of family members. Sick Leave may not be donated to another employee. All sick leave pay is subject to the approval of the employee's supervisor.
- C. If management suspects the abuse of sick leave, management may require documentation prior to the payment of sick leave. Management may conduct whatever investigation it feels is necessary to determine whether sick leave is being abused. Failure to cooperate in an investigation of abuse of sick leave will result in the denial of pay for such time and may result in disciplinary action.
- D. Patterns of sick leave usage such as repeated use of the day before or day after an employee's days off or holidays shall be considered an abuse of sick leave and cause for denial of payment and disciplinary action including dismissal.
- E. Accrued sick leave will not be paid at termination of employment, except for deputies who have completed at least fifteen (15) years of County consecutive service and who retire under P.E.R.A.. Such deputies may convert 50% of their accrued sick leave to a lump sum pay or paid leave. No accrual of sick leave or vacation will occur during the use of such converted paid leave.

9.2 VACATION AND VACATION ACCRUAL.

- A. Deputies will accrue vacation as follows:
- 1 to 24 months of service - 3.077 hrs. accrual per pay period
 - 24 mos. +1 day to 120 mos. of service - 4.615 hrs. accrual per pay period
 - 120 mos. + 1 day and over of service - 6.154 hrs. accrual per pay period
- B. Subject to the staffing requirements of the Department, the Sheriff or his designee may allow more than one deputy to be off on vacation on any one day. In normal situations only one deputy will be allowed vacation on any one day. All requests for vacation will be considered on a first come first served basis. All requests will be time stamped by the employee when submitted to the Sheriff.

9.3 HOLIDAYS

- A. The following holidays will be observed by employees in this bargaining unit:

within a 12 month period.) |
- B. Deputies who do not work on a holiday will be paid eight (8) hours of holiday pay at the employee's regular rate of pay.
- C. Deputies required to work on a holiday will receive eight (8) hours of holiday pay at straight time pay plus pay at the employee's regular rate of pay for the actual hours worked. All time worked on a holiday is counted as time worked for the purpose of computing overtime compensation as per the overtime provision of this Agreement.

SECTION 10. THE SAFETY AND HEALTH COMMITTEE.

The County Safety Committee meets periodically for the purpose of reviewing

appropriate safety and health matters. The Committee may be asked to visit the various work places, to investigate serious accidents, to recommend new rules and procedures, to recommend preventative measures, and to provide instructions to employees.

If the Association has a safety concern the issue will be brought to the attention of the Department in an attempt to resolve the issue. If the issue is not resolved at the Department level the President of the Association or his designee may bring the issue before the County Safety Committee.

SECTION 11. SENIORITY.

- A. Except for sections which contain specific different definitions in this agreement, seniority is defined as follows:
- B. Higher ranks have seniority on junior ranks. The employee with the most continuous service within rank is senior within that given rank. For the purposes of breaking a tie in seniority, the first criteria to be applied shall be continuous service with the Department, with the employee with the most continuous time being senior. Should the continuous service with the Department be identical, then the tie will be broken by the use of employee numbers or lottery numbers, whichever is applicable. The employee with the lowest number is senior. The term continuous service shall be interpreted to mean total service from the date of last hire as an employee of the Department.
- C. When cut backs occur, the mandatory transfers between units shall be made in such a way as to maximize the efficiency and effectiveness of the Department. In making such transfer decisions, the following facts shall be considered:
 - a. The needs of the department.
 - b. The needs of the county.
 - c. The qualifications of the employee.
 - d. The demonstrated abilities of the employee.
 - e. All things being equal seniority will be considered.

SECTION 12. EXTRA DUTY ASSIGNMENTS.

- A. The County will post extra duty assignments, except in emergency situations, and deputies will be allowed to sign up for such assignments. In situations where an insufficient number of deputies sign up for such assignments, the assignments will be made in reverse order of seniority. It is recognized that posting of extra duty assignments is not always possible in case of emergencies, such as forest fires.
- B. Extra duty assignments paid from County funds will be compensated as per regular County policy and procedure or this contract whichever is appropriate. Extra duty assignments performed for other agencies is addressed in Subsection C. below.
- C. Extra duty assignments performed for other agencies will identify on the posting the compensation paid by that agency for the given assignments. This time is not County work time and shall not be counted towards overtime compensation.

SECTION 13. OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT.

Employees shall consider the County of Lincoln as their primary employer. Employees may request approval to participate in outside employment. Outside employment is subject to recommendation of the Undersheriff or designee and the approval of the Sheriff. The factors considered in reviewing requests for outside employment are the employee's performance, attendance, and number of hours to be worked in outside employment and whether a conflict of interest exists. Approvals for outside employment are for a period of 12 months. Approval of outside employment may be rescinded at anytime if any of the four factors considered for approval become an issue.

SECTION 14. RETIREMENT.

The County will continue the current PERA retirement program.

SECTION 15. HOURS OF WORK AND OVERTIME.

- A. The normal workweek will be forty (40) hours. The normal workday will be eight (8) hours for five (5) days.
- B. Deputies will be paid overtime in accordance with the FLSA Section 207-K. Overtime at 1-1/2 time the regular rate of pay will be paid for all hours worked in excess of 80 hours in a fourteen (14) day cycle.
- C. Compensatory time at 1-1/2 the time worked may be paid in lieu of monetary compensation subject to the approval of the County Commission as part of the department budget.
- D. Paid leave is not and will not be counted as time worked for the purpose of computing overtime compensation. Deputies who are on their regular days off during a Holiday and are called in to work within that Holiday shall be paid eight (8) hours of Holiday Pay at straight time, plus time and one half for actual hours worked on the Holiday. This time worked will not be pyramided in the calculation of overtime compensation.
- E. Under normal circumstances management will assign consecutive days off.
- F. Management will identify when deputies may take their rest and lunch breaks. Deputies shall not congregate at one place for rest breaks.

SECTION 16. DEPUTY'S LIABILITY PROTECTION.

- A. Pursuant to 41-41 et seq., N.M.S.A. (1978), as amended, the New Mexico Tort Claims

Act, the County shall provide protection to Deputies from liability arising out of acts committed during the performance of their activities in the conduct of their office and within the scope of their duties.

- B. Adequate legal counsel will be provided as set forth in the New Mexico Tort Claims Act, Section 41-41 et seq., N.M.S.A. (1978), as amended.

SECTION 17. GROUP MEDIAL AND HOSPITALIZATION INSURANCE.

Deputies may apply to participate in the County's group medical and hospitalization insurance plan. Eligible employees, their spouse, and eligible children may opt to participate in the plan. The County will continue to pay its current rate of contribution of the premium for the duration of this Agreement.

SECTION 18. PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS.

Employees may be required to take and pass a medical examination at any time to determine their mental or physical capabilities to perform their assignments satisfactorily. Written documentation will be provided to the employee. Such examinations will be at no cost to the employee and will be performed by medical personnel selected by the County. Employees may take a medical examination with a physician of their choice at their expense. If it is determined by the County that an employee cannot perform duties and the employee is eligible the employee will be afforded all rights under the American Disabilities Act. Employees may voluntarily request a mental test.

All employees of the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department shall be required to pass a job related pre-employment mental and physical examination. The County may require the employee to submit to drug and/or alcohol testing as permitted by law.

SECTION 19. CREDIT UNION.

Employees may join the State Employees Credit Union and/or the Otero Federal Credit Union by completing a membership and payroll deduction card. The County will make payroll deductions for the County sponsored Credit Unions.

SECTION 20. WORKERS COMPENSATION.

The County will continue to provide Workers Compensation coverage for employees as required by state law.

SECTION 21. JURY DUTY AND WITNESS PAY.

Deputies required to serve on jury duty will be compensated as required by law. Other compensation received (other than meal and travel allowance) shall be turned over to the County.

Deputies will be compensated when appearing as a witness on behalf of the County or when appearing in their official capacity representing the County.

SECTION 22. ON-CALL AND CALL BACK.

- A. Deputies "on-call" will be provided pagers or radios and will not be required to remain at home for the purpose of "On-Call Status".
- B. Deputies called in to work will be compensated for the time actually worked.
- C. The determination as to the need for the use of on-call status and how many deputies are required will be made by the Sheriff or his designee.
- D. Deputies assigned to on-call status with a pager or radio will be compensated an additional \$10.00 per assignment per 24 hour period.

SECTION 23. TRAINING AND EDUCATION.

The County will provide the training that is required by State and Federal laws. It is recognized by the parties that the County can change a deputy's work schedule for the purpose of providing required training and certification.

The County also offers specialized training. Any deputy interested in such training should consult with his/her immediate supervisor.

The pursuit of a college education must be done during the employee's time off. Any and all educational development or training is subject to the recommendation of the Under Sheriff and the approval of the Sheriff.

SECTION 24. LAY OFF AND RECALL.

- A. In the event that a reduction in force is necessary, the County shall provide the Association an opportunity to suggest alternatives.
- B. When it is necessary to have a reduction in work force, employees will be laid off in reverse order of seniority.
- C. Employees laid off due to a reduction in force will be called back to work in their seniority order.
- D. The term "seniority" for the purposes of this section shall mean time in rank. In situations where officers are required to bump into a lower rank, the officer moving to the lower rank shall be considered senior in that rank. As officers are called back, the

officers assigned to lower ranks will be returned to the former rank, in order of seniority as vacancies become available.

- E. The employee may remain on lay off status for a total of twelve (12) calendar months. If the employee is not recalled within twelve (12) months or if the employee rejects a position offered to the employee, the County shall have no further employment obligation to the laid off employee and the employee will be terminated. Employees must provide and maintain a correct mailing address. Failure to provide a correct address shall result in a forfeiture of any recall right.

SECTION 25. INTERNAL AFFAIRS.

- A. The Internal Affairs Unit is established as a staff investigative body responsible to the Sheriff.
- B. This section establishes the guidelines for conduct of Internal Affairs interrogations. The existence of the Internal Affairs Unit does not lessen a commanding officer's authority or responsibility.
 - 1. The interrogation of a police officer will normally be conducted when the officer is on duty or during the officer's normal working hours, unless the urgency of the investigation requires otherwise;
 - 2. Interrogations will take place normally at the Sheriff's administrative offices, unless the urgency of the investigation requires otherwise.
 - 3. If an officer is directed to leave his/her post and report for an interview, the officer shall immediately notify his/her supervisor.
 - 4. The officer under investigation will be informed of the name and rank of the person in charge of the interrogation and all other persons who will be present during the interrogation.
 - 5. An officer will be informed of the nature of the investigation, and the names of all known complainants shall be disclosed to the officer unless the chief administrator of the officer's employer determines that the identification of the complainant shall not be disclosed because it is necessary for the protection of an informant or because disclosure would jeopardize or compromise the integrity or security of the investigation. In the event that disciplinary action is taken against an employee and that the employee files a grievance the complainant will be made known.
 - 6. Each interrogation session shall not exceed two (2) hours unless the parties mutually consent to continuation of the session and there shall not be more than

two (2) interrogation sessions within any twenty-four (24) hour period, unless the parties mutually consent to additional sessions or if the urgency of the investigation requires otherwise, provided there shall be at least one (1) hour rest period between the sessions.

An officer shall be allowed to attend to physical necessities during the course of an interrogation session. The combined duration of an officer's work shift and any interrogation session shall not exceed fourteen (14) hours within a twenty-four (24) hour period, unless the urgency of the investigation requires otherwise.

7. An officer shall not be subjected to offensive language or illegal coercion by his interrogator in the course of an interrogation session;
 8. Any interrogation of an officer shall be recorded, either mechanically or by a stenographer, and the complete interrogation will be published as a transcript. Any recesses called during the interrogation shall be noted in the transcript.
 9. After reviewing all the information collected in the course of the investigation of a peace officer, the chief administrator of the officer's employer may order the officer to submit to a polygraph examination administered by a licensed polygraph examiner, provided that all other reasonable investigative means have been exhausted and the officer has been advised of the administrator's reasons for ordering the polygraph examination.
 10. A peace officer may file a written response to any document containing adverse comments entered into the officer's personnel file and the response shall be filed with the officer's employer within thirty (30) days after the document was entered in the officer's personnel file. A peace officer's written response shall be attached to the document.
 11. When any peace officer is under administrative investigation and a determination has been made to commence a criminal investigation, the officer shall be notified.
 12. Any officer who knowingly withholds evidence or information pertaining to an investigation will have provided just cause for disciplinary action including dismissal.
 13. All files and reports of investigations by the Internal Affairs Unit are confidential. Such records are intended for the exclusive use of the Sheriff, County Attorney and County Manager.
- C. A copy of the State of New Mexico "Peace Officer's Employer-Employee Relations Act" will be attached as Appendix A to this agreement.

- D. The department may contract for services with an experienced individual or organization to conduct an internal investigation.

SECTION 26. DISCIPLINARY ACTION.

- A. In the event that an investigation results in the implementation of disciplinary action, if the investigated employee so requests, the Association may designate a representative to participate at all stages of the grievance process. The employee will be provided copies of the written charges and the disciplinary action proposed.
- B. In notifying employees of disciplinary actions an attempt will be made to notify an employee in every-day language. The language need only be specific enough to notify the employee of the alleged misconduct and action proposed.
- C. Disciplinary actions shall include written reprimands, suspensions, demotions and dismissal.
- D. The County will use progressive discipline when the County believes such approach is appropriate. This shall not limit the County's right to take whatever action the County feels is appropriate based on the seriousness of the infraction including dismissal on the first or subsequent infraction or misconduct.
- E. Prior to taking any disciplinary action the employee will be presented with the charges and afforded the opportunity to respond to the charges. It is recognized by the parties that it is the prerogative of management to identify the specific time that the discipline will be carried out.
- F. Disciplinary actions that are grieved shall be processed through the grievance procedure identified in this Agreement.

SECTION 27. GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE.

- A. This is the grievance procedure available to bargaining unit employees. Grievance is defined as a dispute pertaining to the employment terms, conditions and related personnel matters or a contested disciplinary action taken by management.
- B. Association staff, bargaining unit employees, or management staff shall not coerce or retaliate against any grievant, grievant witness, management witness, or any party in interest who is identified as a participant in a grievance hearing.
- C. The Association and/or the grievant shall attempt to resolve the issue with the supervisor. If a satisfactory solution cannot be reached with the supervisor, and the grievant wishes to pursue the grievance, the written grievance is filed with the Sheriff.

- D. The written grievance must be filed with the Sheriff within ten (10) days of the date the grievant knew or should have known of the issue that generated the grievance. The Sheriff or his designee shall schedule a meeting with the grievant and/or the Association within ten (10) days of the receipt of the grievance. Within ten (10) days of the meeting the Sheriff or the designee will render a written decision. Failure to render a decision within the required time limit shall cause the grievance to be advanced to the next level of the grievance procedure.
- E. If the grievant is not satisfied with the Sheriff's decision, the Association and the grievant may within ten (10) days of the Sheriff's decision give written notice to the County that the issue is being submitted to arbitration. The arbitration will be conducted by an arbitrator to be selected from a list of seven (7) names supplied by the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service. The flip of a coin will determine who will strike the first name on the list. The parties will alternate the striking of names until one name is left. That individual shall be the arbitrator. The decision of the arbitrator is final and binding on the parties. The cost of the arbitrator shall be borne equally by the parties.

SECTION 28. PROBATION PERIOD.

It is understood and agreed by both parties to this Agreement that the probationary period for new Deputies includes the period of time from the date of hire as a permanent full-time employee through a period of twelve (12) months. After six (6) months probationary deputies will be allowed to request utilization of their accrued leave, both vacation and sick leave upon approval of the Sheriff or his designee. Deputies will remain on probation for twelve (12) months from date of hire.

SECTION 29. FILLING VACANCIES.

- A. A vacancy is a vacant bargaining unit position that the department decides to fill.
- B. Promotional opportunities/vacancies within the bargaining unit will be posted in departmental bulletin boards for a period of seven (7) calendar days. Qualified employees interested in being considered for the vacancies will submit a written request prior to the application deadline. If an employee is on approved leave during the posting period the employee will be allowed to apply immediately upon return to duty if done prior to the testing date.
- C. Qualified employees who submit a timely application may compete in the promotional process.
- D. The process will consist of a written examination, a structured oral examination and/or practical examination. The written examination will require a passing score of 70%. Employees who pass the written examination may proceed to the structured oral and/or practical examination. The oral examination shall include a review of the employee's

performance evaluation.

- E. Should less than two employees attain a score of 70% or higher, the Sheriff may waive the passing score and allow the two (2) individuals with the highest grades to proceed to the oral examination.
- F. Employees who participate in the written and oral examinations will be ranked in order of combined scores, the selection for promotion will be made from the top two (2) deputies on the promotional list.
- G. The written examination will be a validated examination.
- H. Employees that are promoted will perform all of the duties and fulfill all the responsibilities of the position of Sergeant and will not be able to hold an office in the Association.
- I. The promotional list will remain in effect for twelve (12) months.

SECTION 30. STAFFING.

It is recognized that it is the right of the Employer to determine the number of employees to be employed in each job classification. The Association supports attempts to insure that sufficient personnel and resources are available to accomplish the delivery of timely and safe services to the citizens of Lincoln County.

SECTION 31. LINCOLN COUNTY AND SHERIFF DEPARTMENT RULES AND REGULATIONS.

The County and the Department may amend or expand the current rules and regulations which directly affect or may affect bargaining unit employees provided provisions of this contract or any Memorandum of Understanding are not violated.

The County and the Department will provide a written copy (only one set) of the current or amended rules and regulations, or policies and procedures to each employee. The Association President shall be provided a written copy of any and all anticipated amendments to regulations and will be provided with the opportunity to respond in writing within five (5) days prior to implementation unless the change is due to an emergency situation.

SECTION 32. PERSONNEL FILE.

Personnel files are the property of the County. Personnel files represent the employment history of the employees and shall not be purged except by order or decision of a court or arbitrator of competent jurisdiction.

SECTION 33. UNIFORMS.

It is understood by the parties to this Agreement that the Sheriff establishes uniform regulation of the Department. All Deputies will be paid a uniform allowance of \$50.00 per month, payable quarterly by Lincoln County. The Deputies will be responsible for purchasing the assigned uniform and its upkeep. Should the Deputies uniform appearance become unacceptable the Sheriff or his designee may take disciplinary action on the Deputy.

Lincoln County will provide bullet resistant vests to deputies as needed. Deputy will be responsible for: handcuffs, leather gear, jacket, hats or caps (Sheriff or his designee will designate color and type). The Sheriff will set the standards for firearms and uniforms.

SECTION 34. FIREARMS.

Firearms regulations of the Department prescribed in the Standard Operating Procedures Manual or General Order, effective July 1, 1996, shall remain in full force and effect for the term of this agreement. Employees who carry a firearm shall be required to remain certified as required by the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy. The County shall furnish ammunition for required certification and training two (2) times a year.

SECTION 35. COMPENSATION.

A. Sheriff's Deputies Pay Plan:

- DEPUTY III. Certified with 24 to 60 months experience in Law Enforcement and 200 hours of advanced training - \$23.1804 per hour.
- DEPUTY IV. Certified with 60 to 120 months Law Enforcement experience and over 400 hours of advanced training - \$24.6791 per hour.
- DEPUTY V. Certified with 120 months experience in Law Enforcement and over 500 hours of advanced training - \$26.1936 per hour.

All advanced training must be recognized by the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy.

- B. The Sergeants' \$2,400.00 annual compensation will be converted to \$1.1538 per hour and included in the Sergeants regular hourly rate.

SECTION 36. DUES CHECK OFF.

- A. There shall be no solicitation of Association membership during County paid time.
- B. The County will, for the duration of this agreement, make dues deductions from bargaining unit employees who sign voluntary dues deduction authorization forms. Such deduction will be made each pay period in the amount identified by the President of the Association and must be submitted to the County payroll office at least ten (10) days prior to the effective date of the deduction. The County will forward the dues withheld to the Association.
- C. The Association shall indemnify and save the County harmless against any and all claims, demands, suits or other forms of liability that shall arise out of or as a result of any conduct taken by the County for the purpose of complying with this section.

SECTION 37. COPIES OF THE AGREEMENT.

An original hand executed master copy of the Agreement will be provided to each party and each party is responsible for reproducing and distributing copies to their constituents.

SECTION 38. CONTRACT INCLUDES ENTIRE AGREEMENT.

The parties agree that they have had the opportunity to negotiate on all issues introduced for negotiations and it is understood and agreed by and between the parties, hereto, that this Agreement is the complete agreement between the parties and replaces any and all previous agreements. The County and the Association may upon mutual agreement negotiate a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) which may change the provisions of this contract.

SECTION 39. SAVINGS CLAUSE.

Should any part of this agreement or any provision contained herein be declared invalid by a District Court of competent jurisdiction, the validity of the remaining portions shall not be affected. Should this occur, the parties may meet to negotiate suitable provision or replace the provision held invalid.

SECTION 40. TERM OF THE AGREEMENT.


- A. This agreement shall be effective the 1st full pay period following ratification/approval of the bargaining unit membership and the County Commission and the signature of the Agreement by the President of the Association; the County Manager; and the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners. This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect through June 30, 2015.

- B. The Association shall provide written notification of the Association's intent to either accept the general wage and benefit increase provided to non-bargaining unit employees or to open negotiations for the following year. This shall be done between the dates of May 31, 2015, and June 30, 2015. If the choice is to open negotiations the Association and the County will be limited to negotiating on wages and three (3) non-economic issues each. If the choice is to accept the general increase granted to non-bargaining unit employees the collective bargaining agreement expiration date shall be extended for an additional twelve (12) months.



Purpose: To obtain board of county commissioners acknowledgement of completion of the 2013 tax year random audit of lodgers.

Discussion:

On May 20, 2014, in accordance with County Ordinance 2004-04, the County Commission selected four lodgers randomly for audit. The audit was to verify the amount of gross rent subject to the occupancy tax.

The vendors to be audited were divided into two pools- one of large businesses and one of smaller businesses. We currently have 29 active vendors.







The County intends to contract with one or more Company(s) for the accomplishment of repair, alteration, modernization, rehabilitation, demolition and construction of structures, debris removal, flood control structures, roads, bridges or other public works projects that may be impacted during an emergency. The following bids at enclosure 1 were received and opened on Tuesday, August 12, 2014. Each contractor submitted a turnkey, per hour price based on FEMA codes for individual pieces of equipment; the rates are all inclusive, including transportation, permits, operator, fuel and maintenance. These hourly rates, to remain constant throughout the life of the contract, were analyzed and placed in a spreadsheet to determine the best price. 





Discussion: On 8 July, attendees meet on finalizing discussions on the subject application.



SUBJECT: Revision of Indigent Health Care Limits

Purpose: To consider a resolution to add new limits to Indigent Healthcare payments for Lincoln County indigent residents and providers.

Discussion:

To compensate for low enrollment numbers and claims, the Indigent Healthcare Administrator has proposed to increase certain policy limits to its current Resolution 2013-14, see enclosure 1.

Last fiscal year 2013-2014, the Indigent program expended \$205,228 on indigent claims in total. \$205,228 is 52% of \$393,278, which was the indigent claims budget.

Looking back last year on what was spent on the Presbyterian Ambulance Service (ground ambulance), the indigent program expended \$22,099. Under the proposed increase policy limit, there could have been an additional \$27,982 paid out, totaling \$50,081.

The air ambulance category currently has a \$1000 policy limit per year. The indigent program paid \$2975 to the providers last year. The proposed increase, if used last year, would have had an additional \$5,000 in payments.

The indigent program is contracted with six out-of-county hospitals. Four of the six contracted hospitals sent claims to the indigent program. Eastern New Mexico Medical Center, Gerald Champion Regional Medical Center, Presbyterian Hospital in Albuquerque and University of New Mexico Hospital received a combined total of \$118,620, from the indigent program. Looking at the claims denied from these facilities, for the reason of capitation, and it was determined that an additional \$85,000 could have been paid out.

The physician category has had only one provider that has had claims denied due to capitation. It was found that the New Mexico Oncology and Hematology could have received an additional \$10,000, if the proposed increase was used last year.

In summary, if the proposed increase in policy limits were used last year, the indigent program would have paid out \$333,210 on indigent claims.

Recommendation: Approve resolution 2014-13 for the new fiscal year 2014-2015.

RESOLUTION NO. 2014-13

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING REVISIONS TO THE INDIGENT CLAIMS POLICY LIMITS PAYABLE FROM THE LINCOLN COUNTY INDIGENT HEALTHCARE FUND.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Lincoln County needs to increase and impose Policy Limits as stated herein to keep the program viable; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds that it is best interests of the citizens of the County of Lincoln to amend the qualifying income schedule and policy limits payable under the Lincoln County Indigent Hospital/Health Care Ordinance.



**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN THE
VILLAGE OF RUIDOSO
AND
THE COUNTY OF LINCOLN**

FOR THE PROVISION OF REGULATION SERVICES OF RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL CONSTRUCTION WITHIN CERTAIN SPECIFIED AREAS OF THE COUNTY OF LINCOLN.

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into between the COUNTY OF LINCOLN ("COUNTY") and the VILLAGE OF RUIDOSO ("Ruidoso"). County and Ruidoso are collectively referred to as "the Parties." The common power to be exercised is as set forth in the Agreement.

WHEREAS, the Parties are public agencies, as defined in the Act, and are authorized by law to enter into this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Construction Industries Licensing Act (CILA), NMSA, 1978, § 60-13-44 E, the County has the right of review of all specifications of residential and commercial general construction and the responsibility to ensure compliance with construction standards adopted by the County; and

WHEREAS, Ruidoso is a Municipality as defined in NMSA, 1978, § 12-6-2., and has by ordinance adopted the conditions, provisions, limitations and terms of a building code pursuant to its powers under NMSA, 1978, § 3-18-1; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to NMSA, 1978, § 3-18-6 A. (4) and C. (1), a municipality has jurisdiction over building permits issued by the municipality except with respect to construction specifically exempted by the CILA; and may authorize the investigation of code violations or activities of licensees or others that constitute violations of NMSA 1978, § 60-13-23, 24, or 36; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into this Agreement in order to effectuate administrative efficiency in the regulation of residential and commercial general construction, including mechanical, electrical and plumbing inspections and permits located within the geographical boundaries of the County in those areas designated on exhibit "A" which are incorporated herein by reference as they currently exist or may be modified in the future by agreement of the parties.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT THE REGULATION OF RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL GENERAL CONSTRUCTION LOCATED WITHIN THE GEOGRAPHICAL BOUNDARIES OF THE COUNTY AND WITHIN THE GEOGRAPHICAL BOUNDARIES SET FORTH

ON EXHIBIT "A", WHICH ARE NOT OWNED BY THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO, OR RUIDOSO SHALL BE ACCOMPLISHED AS FOLLOWS:

1. **AUTHORIZATION AND SCOPE.** Ruidoso is hereby granted the authority to regulate residential and commercial construction located within the geographical boundaries of the County in the geographical boundaries set forth on Exhibit "A" as they currently exist or may be modified in the future by agreement of the parties, which are not owned by the State of New Mexico, subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein. Ruidoso will issue, monitor and maintain documents for all construction permits and provide inspection services for said permits. Ruidoso will also provide Building Code Enforcement services subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement within the constraints of applicable law.
2. **PREREQUISITES.**
 - a. Ruidoso shall, at all times relevant to this Agreement, maintain a permitting and inspection program and shall employ full time plan review personnel and electrical, mechanical, plumbing and general construction inspectors who are certified by the International Code Council and the State of New Mexico throughout the term of this Agreement.
 - b. If Ruidoso fails to maintain a permitting and inspection program, or if it fails to replace within four (4) months or one hundred twenty (120) days and employ the requisite inspectors as set forth in this agreement, the County may terminate this agreement by providing and delivering written notice to Ruidoso of termination at least four (4) months or one hundred twenty (120) days prior to the effective date of termination and take such action as is necessary to provide for these services in house or through an agreement with the State of New Mexico.
3. **BUILDING STANDARDS.** The building standards applied by Ruidoso shall be, at the least, the minimum State standards, as required by NMSA, 1978, § 3-17-6 A.
4. **VIOLATION ENFORCEMENT AND MONITORING.** Ruidoso will assist the State with enforcement and provide monitoring of Building Ordinance violations consistent with State Law.
5. **TERM.** The **initial** term of this agreement shall be for a period of ~~six months~~ **one year**, from the date of its execution by the last party signing. During that ~~trial~~ period the parties shall regularly communicate concerning the performance of the services contemplated herein and shall jointly monitor permitting fees, inspection performance time frames, and any other issues or performance standards contained on Exhibit "B" which is attached hereto and is incorporated herein by reference. Thereafter, in the event the parties determine to continue with this

agreement it shall continue until terminated pursuant to the terms hereof or by operation of law.

6. **TERMINATION.** This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon delivery of written notice to the other at least four (4) months or one hundred twenty (120) days prior to the effective date of termination. By such termination, neither party may nullify or void any obligation required to have been performed prior to the effective date of termination.
7. **SUBCONTRACTING AND ASSIGNMENT.** Ruidoso may not subcontract any portion of the services to be performed by it pursuant to this Agreement, assign this Agreement, or obligate itself in any manner to any third party with respect to any rights or responsibilities under this Agreement, without prior written consent of the County.
8. **RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS.** Ruidoso shall account for receipts and disbursements relating hereto and shall make all relevant financial records available to the County upon request, and shall maintain all related records in accordance with state records retention policies after this Agreement has expired or has been terminated.
9. **AMENDMENT.** This Agreement may not be altered, changed, or amended except by instrument in writing executed by the parties hereto and approved by the Secretary of the New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration.
10. **WAIVER.** No waiver of any breach or term or condition of this Agreement shall constitute a waiver of any other term or condition of this Agreement, or a subsequent waiver of the same breach or term or condition. No waiver of any term or condition of this Agreement shall be valid or binding unless in writing and signed by the party alleged to have granted the waiver.
11. **GOVERNING LAW.** This agreement and the interpretation hereof shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Mexico pertaining to such agreements. The District Court of the Twelfth Judicial District within and for Lincoln County shall be the court of venue for resolution of any disputes that arise pursuant to this agreement.
12. **MERGER OF PRIOR AGREEMENTS.** This Agreement incorporates all of the conditions, agreements and understandings between the parties concerning the subject matter hereof, and all such conditions, agreements and understandings have been merged into this Agreement. No prior condition, agreement, or understanding, verbal or otherwise, of the parties or their agents shall be valid or enforceable unless embodied in this Agreement.
13. **HOLD HARMLESS.** Neither party shall be responsible for liability incurred as a result of the other party's acts or omissions in connection with this Agreement. Any liability incurred in connection with this Agreement is subject to the

immunities and limitations of the New Mexico Tort Claims Act. Nothing contained in this Agreement should be construed as a waiver of the protections afforded to local governments under the New Mexico Tort Claims Act.

14. **APPROPRIATIONS.** The terms of this Agreement are contingent upon sufficient appropriations and authorization being made by the Village Council for the performance of this Agreement.

15. **ANALYSIS AND REPORTING OF FEES COLLECTED.** ~~For a period of six months from the date of signing of this Agreement,~~ The parties agree that the Village of Ruidoso shall provide a report to the County of Lincoln at a minimum of a quarterly basis which will identify the building permits issued, the fees charged, a cost comparison of fees charged with the cost of providing said services, and the location of the services rendered: i.e. within the municipal limits of the Village of Ruidoso or in the County. Once the data identified herein has been collected for a period of not less than six months, the parties will utilize the data to determine whether or not a portion of the fees collected by the Village of Ruidoso should be paid over to the County of Lincoln.



FOR INSPECTIONS AND PERMITTING IN
LINCOLN COUNTY

1. The fee schedule for inspections and permitting pursuant to this Memorandum of Understanding is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The Parties hereby agree that the fee for inspections to be charged County residents shall be the same as those charged Ruidoso.
2. Requests to schedule inspections shall be telephoned to an automated inspection request phone number. The permit holder shall provide all information required by the inspector when requesting an inspection to be scheduled. Requests will be processed the next business day and will be scheduled as work load and staff availability permit. Every effort will be made to schedule and complete inspections within one (1) to two (2) business days.
3. When an applicant appears for a building permit, or downloads an application on line, the applicant shall be provided with an application form which shall include a space for County approval. The applicant shall be instructed to take the application form to the County Annex building for review. After insuring that all County requirements are fulfilled, the County shall approve the application form and the applicant shall be instructed to return to Village Hall to complete the application and pay the applicable fee.
4. The County review shall include at least the following elements:
 - A. Flood plain documentation, certification and approval where necessary;
 - B. Driveway cut approval (contingent on payment of the required fee and inspection by the Road Department);
 - C. Registration/sign up with Greentree Solid Waste Authority for solid waste collection for both household collection and construction debris where applicable;
 - D. Address issued by County Rural Addressing.


