13 Minutes of the Special Meeting of the Lincoln County Commission held at 8:30 AM on February
14 18, 2014 in the County Commission Chambers, Lincoln County Courthouse, in Carrizozo, New

19 Chair Powell called the Regular Meeting of the Board of County Commissioners to order at
20 8:33:11 AM.

77 **8. Smokey Bear District Ranger Update – Larry Cordova**

78
79 Ms. Taylor informed Ranger David Warnack was on temporary assignment in Flagstaff, AZ for
80 several months and Larry Cordova was the Acting District Ranger in his absence. Ms. Taylor
81 stated Acting Ranger Cordova was unable to attend this meeting.

82
83 **9. Greentree Solid Waste Authority**

- 84
85 a. Rate Collection Activities

86
87 Ms. Taylor provided examples of complaints received from residents related to inconsistent
88 billing practices. Ms. Taylor stated Debra Ingle, Operational Supervisor and Joe Lewandowski,
89 Operations Consultant from GSWA were present and might be able to provide additional
90 information to support practices and GSWA's request for liens to be placed on particular
91 properties.

92
93 Ms. Taylor provided copies of the GSWA draft minutes of GSWA and financial statements.

- 94
95 b. Consideration / Action on GSWA Request for Filing of Liens

96
97 Debra Ingle, Operational Supervisor stated for the past twenty three years GSWA had mailed
98 approximately 38,000 bills to customers on a quarterly basis. Ms. Ingle informed all of the

99 twenty three liens currently presented for recording were approved for that action by the GSWA
100 Board in 2011. Ms. Ingle stated subsequently these twenty three property owners entered into
101 payment agreements with GSWA but they had since defaulted on those agreements resulting in
102 the request for liens to be placed on the properties.

103
104 Ms. Taylor noted the bills do not reflect a property description which was confusing to the
105 owner. Ms. Ingle stated a property owner number tying the bill to an Assessor's parcel record
106 was referenced on the bill.

107
108 Commissioner Draper requested a copy of the associated payment agreements as supporting
109 documentation for the liens. Commissioner Doth requested input from property owners
110 regarding the placement of liens.

111
112 c. Current Status of County / GSWA Litigation; Negotiation efforts

113
114 Ms. Taylor provided a summary of actions including the hiring of the law firm of Melendres,
115 Melendres, and Harrigan and sending the notice of intent to withdraw to GSWA. Chair Powell
116 stated the County was working to remove "personality conflicts" from the issue by hiring outside
117 counsel as a second opinion and requested GSWA consider similar action.

118
119 Commissioner Minter advocated for scheduling a public hearing for a rate increase as
120 requested by GSWA. Chair Powell opined that scheduling a public hearing at this time would be
121 premature. Commissioner Stone expressed belief the problems between the entities needed to
122 be discussed by Commissioners and GSWA board members only, excluding attorneys and
123 managers, in an effort to resolve issues.

124
125 **10. Lincoln County Detention Center Update – Warden Anderson**

126
127 Warden Arthur Anderson informed on monthly bookings and releases at the Lincoln County
128 Detention Center and stated the total average daily population for the month of February 2014
129 was 136. Warden Anderson stated the current population was 137 including 17 BIA prisoners
130 and zero US Marshal prisoners.

131
132 Chair Powell commended Warden Anderson for working with the New Mexico Association of
133 Counties on their accreditation program for detention centers.

134
135 Chair Powell recessed the Regular Meeting and convened the Board of Finance at 8:57:38 AM.

136
137 **11. Board of Finance – Glenna Robbins, Treasurer**

138
139 Glenna Robbins, Treasurer provided a copy of the Treasurer's current investment policy and
140 collateral agreement for review. Ms. Robbins also directed attention to the Treasurers
141 Financial Report for the month ending January 31, 2014.

142
143 Ms. Robbins stated the purpose of the investment policy as updated in 2008 was to provide
144 necessary limitations and guidelines to assure compliance with NM State statutes. Ms. Robbins
145 stated prudent investment objectives were safety, availability, and a reasonable rate of return on
146 investments.

147
148 Ms. Robbins stated to meet safety objectives the investment policy defined types of investments
149 and the associated collateral agreement needed to meet or exceed State requirements. Ms.

150 Robbins explained Lincoln County set a higher safety standard by requiring deposits to be
151 collateralized at 102% after FDIC insurance. Ms. Robbins noted in the Treasurer's Monthly
152 Financial Report a list of each bank holding deposits in Lincoln County along with investment
153 limits, current deposits, and current collateral.

154
155 Ms. Robbins stated the investment policy objective of diversity was addressed by the
156 distribution of investments with current investments of 6% in Certificates of Deposit, 53% in
157 Money Market investment accounts, 30% in operational interest earning accounts, 3% in debit
158 service accounts held by New Mexico Finance Authority, and 8% held with LPL Financial. Ms.
159 Robbins explained the 8% invested with LPL Financial was basically an amount equivalent to
160 the 3/12th DFA required reserve. Ms. Robbins informed 89% of total investments were held by
161 banks in Lincoln County.

162
163 Ms. Robbins stated 83% of all investments were liquid and ready for use to cover County
164 expenses when needed. Ms. Robbins further detailed the current rate of return on investments
165 and noted the average State overnight rate of return for the month of January 2014 was .06%.
166 Ms. Robbins stated that even with a lower rate of return to attain 102% collateralization, Lincoln
167 County still currently exceeded the State overnight rate of return on investments.

168
169 Ms. Robbins discussed how the Treasurer's office worked with the Finance Department to
170 ensure budgeting compliance and to ensure sufficient funds in operational accounts prior to
171 issuing payments.

172
173 Chair Powell adjourned the Board of Finance and reconvened the Regular Meeting at 9:06:56
174 AM.

175
176 **18. Consideration and approval of a Proclamation**

177
178 Ms. Taylor informed Magistrate Judge Martha McKnight Proctor retired from public office in
179 January of 2014 after serving twenty five consecutive years as an elected official in Lincoln
180 County. Ms. Taylor stated Judge Proctor had served as County Clerk for fourteen years and
181 then Magistrate Judge for an additional eleven years. Ms. Taylor stated the Board of
182 Commissioners wished to honor Judge Proctor for her dedication by proclamation.

183
184 Chair Powell read the proclamation and presented it to Judge Proctor in recognition of her years
185 of service and many accomplishments. Chair Powell stated by virtue of the Proclamation
186 February 18, 2014 was declared as Martha McKnight Proctor Day in Lincoln County.

187
188 **12. Presentation – Capitan FFA National Forestry Team**

189
190 Todd Proctor, Capitan FFA Advisor for more than twenty three years explained this was
191 National FFA week commemorating the importance of agriculture and the natural resource
192 sciences to both the County and the State of New Mexico.

193
194 Mr. Proctor stated Capitan FFA Forestry Team members first won the State FFA Forestry
195 Contest and then traveled to the National FFA Convention in Louisville, Kentucky to represent
196 the State of New Mexico. Mr. Proctor stated one individual on the team was also recognized at
197 the competition as a Natural Science award winner.

198

199 Kylie Hutchison, Ian McWilliams, and Maggie Rich each discussed their experience competing
200 at the State level and their attendance at the National FFA Convention. Members of the team
201 not present were: Layne Southard, Walker Bymoan, and Wade Stearns.
202

203 Mr. Proctor acknowledge the support of the State and National Forestry departments in Capitan,
204 the Soil & Water Conservation District, the Lincoln County Fair Board, the County
205 Commissioners and other organizations and members of the community. Mr. Proctor stated
206 the FFA program provided opportunity for youth to grow and become better citizens in the
207 community.
208

209 Chair Powell acknowledged the dedication of Todd Proctor in his service as an FFA Advisor.
210 Ms. Taylor noted in addition to the teams' Silver Honor in the forestry competition, three
211 members earned a silver medal, and Layne Southard earned a gold medal in the competition.
212 Ms. Taylor stated the members encompassed the FFA ideals of leadership, personal growth,
213 and career success.
214

215 **13. Consideration / Action on MOU with the Village of Ruidoso Permitting Process in**
216 **the County**
217

218 Attorney Morel provided a brief history of actions and discussed the three options available
219 including: developing an independent County inspection department; entering into an MOU with
220 the State Construction Industries Division (CID) for all County inspections; or entering into an
221 MOU with the Village of Ruidoso for inspections in specific areas of the County. Attorney Morel
222 stated according to direction an MOU with the Village of Ruidoso was drafted and after multiple
223 revisions a final draft was developed but not in time for presentation at this meeting.
224

225 Attorney Morel addressed some of the main issues encountered in drafting the MOU including
226 issues on jurisdiction. Attorney Morel stated the Village and the County had agreed to disagree
227 on whether one or the other of the entities had "exclusive" jurisdiction. Attorney Morel stated a
228 map was developed which encompassed the area extending three miles from Village of
229 Ruidoso municipal limits but also included complete subdivisions which were at least partially
230 within the area. Attorney Morel stated language in the MOU regarding the duties of the Village
231 of Ruidoso to maintain an inspection department was minimal as these requirements were
232 defined by CID. Attorney Morel stated both the County and the Village would have termination
233 ability dependent upon four months prior notice.
234

235 Attorney Morel reminded the Board of Commissioners had requested the Village remit to the
236 County a \$25 fee for related County administration from the Village's current fee payments.
237 Attorney Morel noted some of the Village permit fees were only \$25 and suggested for an initial
238 six month period the Village furnish to the County a quarterly report of permits issued, fees
239 charged, and the location of each permit. Attorney Morel stated the County could review the
240 data to determine whether a County administrative fee was appropriate.
241

242 Attorney Morel stated the Village of Ruidoso council would review the MOU prior to presentation
243 to Commissioners at the next regular meeting.
244

245 **19. 9:30 A.M.: PUBLIC COMMENT AND OTHER BUSINESS FROM COUNTY OFFICIALS**
246

247 Commissioner Stone stated he wished to express public support for the County Attorney and his
248 representation of the County during the ongoing legal conflict with Greentree Solid Waste
249 Authority. Commissioner Stone stated the Board of Commissioners acknowledged the integrity

250 of Attorney Morel in all of his actions representing the County and further stated he took
251 personal offense to efforts to disparage Attorney Morel. Commissioner Doth, Commissioner
252 Draper, and Chair Powell voiced agreement with the comments.
253

254 Commissioner Minter reported on her recent attendance at a meeting in Utah of the American
255 Lands Council which was devoted to the topic of State's reclaiming federal property.
256 Commissioner Minter provided signed copies of a book written by William Perry Pendley titled:
257 *Sagebrush Rebel: Reagan's Battle with Environmental Extremists and Why It Matters today* to
258 each Commissioner along with copies to local libraries. Commissioner Minter noted there was
259 continued effort in the NM State Legislature, though unsuccessful to date, to reclaim federal
260 lands.
261

293 **Projects/CAP/ COOP/School Bus Programs by Resolution 2013-31**
294

295 Ms. Taylor presented the proposed Resolution for approval of the County's Fiscal Year
296 2014/2015 State Highway Cooperative funded projects. Ms. Taylor detailed the
297 CAP/COOP/School Bus Route projects as follows:
298

299 a. School Bus: State funds of \$60,871.77 / County match of \$20,290.59 for .85 miles
300 work on Laughing Horse Trail with a total project cost of \$81,162.36.

301
302 b. COOP: State funds of \$54,660.29 / County match of \$18,220.09 for .45 miles work
303 on Laughing Horse Trail with a total project cost of \$72,880.39.
304

305 c. CAP: State funds of \$147,264.11 / County match of \$49,088.04 for 1.77 miles of
306 work on Bancroft Road; .21 miles of work on Biscuit Hill Road; and .14 miles of work on
307 Apple Blossom Road with a total project cost of \$196,342.15.
308

309 Carl Palmer, Road Superintendent explained the projects were presented for Commission
310 approval three separate times first for approval of the specific projects, then for approval of the
311 agreements to complete the projects, and finally for reassignment of remaining funds to
312 additional projects. Mr. Palmer stated the projects presented were scheduled for completion in
313 2015.
314

324 **20. Consideration / Action on New Horizon Request**

325

326 Patsy Sanchez, member of the Board of New Horizons presented a request for facility
327 improvements at the County owned property. Ms. Sanchez noted residents of the facility were
328 present in the audience and expressed the need for public education about the purpose and
329 need for this type of facility.
330

331 Amy Mitchell, Acting Director discussed current conditions needing remedy including flooring
332 problems, the lack of a backup generator to support the facility, and the need for an outside
333 storage facility. Ms. Mitchell stated there were currently 19 residents in the facility with an
334 employed staff of approximately 30. Ms. Mitchell requested financial assistance from the Board
335 of Commissioners.
336

337 Commissioner Draper agreed to promote education about New Horizons and initiate fundraising
338 activities as a member of the Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce. Commissioner Doth suggested
339 requesting discounts on goods and services needed as a non-profit and also suggested the
340 Manager research the option of the facility participating in governmental pricing contracts.
341 Commissioner Stone suggested the facility explore grant funding opportunities.
342

343 Ms. Sanchez requested the County, as owner of the property, approve applying to the Town of
344 Carrizozo for a variance to locate a storage unit on the property. Chair Powell requested
345 Attorney Morel or Curt Temple, Planning Director assist the facility with the application.
346

347 Chair Powell recessed the Regular Meeting at 10:02:23 AM and reconvened at 10:17:52 AM.
348

349 **15. Water issues/Forest/Wildlife Health Programs/Land and Natural Resources** 350 **Advisory Committee (LANRAC)** 351

352 Ms. Taylor introduced Rick Merrick as the new Rural Community Forester with South Central
353 Mountain RC&D. Mr. Merrick explained he was hired to fill the position previously held by Mike
354 Caggiano. Mr. Merrick stated he was excited about working in Lincoln County and working on
355 projects such as the Community Wildfire Protection Plan in addition to community outreach
356 programs to address fire danger and bug disease.
357

358 1. Ms. Taylor reported six new water rights notices were posted on the State Engineer's
359 website as follows:
360

361 a. Re-file of original Notice given on July 15, 2013. SEA GEM LLC and the Village of
362 Ruidoso re-filed No. 01300-1; 01300-2; 01300-3; 0826-2 into 0275 et al; & H271 et al (T)
363 to temporarily change the Surface and Supplemental Groundwater Points of Diversion
364 and Change Place and Purpose of Use in the Hondo Underground Water Basin to the
365 Village of Ruidoso for municipal purposes.

366 b. Re-file of original Notice given on July 15, 2013. The Village of Ruidoso and SEA
367 GEM re-filed Application No. H-50-1 into 0275-1 and H-272 et al (T) for permit to
368 temporarily change point of diversion, place and purpose of use of 26.88 acre feet per
369 annum of groundwater, and change point of diversion from groundwater to surface water
370 and groundwater by ceasing the diversion of waters from well H-50 and severing waters
371 from the commercial use of 8.40 acres of land for municipal purposes.

372 c. On January 29, 2014, Monroy Montes and Jonny Montes, Jr. filed Application No.
373 0866-2 & h-249 for permit to change location of shallow well by abandoning the use of
374 well no. H-249 and drilling well no. H-249-POD2. The purpose is to continue rights for
375 the diversion of 11.52 acre feet per annum of shallow ground water for the irrigation of
376 3.6 acres of land located approximately 2.0 miles west of Glencoe.

377 d. Re-file of original Notice given on September 23, 2013. The Village of Ruidoso and
378 Ruidoso Properties Irrevocable Management Trust filed an application to temporarily
379 change point diversion, place and purpose of use of 123.0 acre feet per annum of
380 groundwater and change point of diversion from groundwater to surface water and
381 groundwater by ceasing the diversion of waters and severing waters from commercial
382 racetrack purposes within the Village of Ruidoso.

383 e. On December 12, 2013, FNF Construction filed application T-6001 for permit to
384 temporarily appropriate underground water within the Tularosa Underground Water
385 Basin not to exceed 90 acre feet per annum for road construction purposes on Highway
386 54.

387 f. On December 12, 2013, FNF Construction filed application T-6002 for permit to
388 temporarily appropriate underground water within the Tularosa Underground Water
389 Basin not to exceed 90 acre feet per annum for road construction purposes on Highway
390 54 at a separate site with different landowner.
391

392 Chair Powell reminded of the mountainous nature of the watershed and noted agricultural use of
393 water was actually minimal in this County. Chair Powell stated applications to retire agriculture
394 rights were not a solution to water problems throughout the County. Chair Powell reminded
395 based on the lack of snowfall there would be minimal runoff for this year and to transfer water
396 rights on paper did not increase the amount of water available.
397

398 Commissioner Draper reported on a presentation by the NM Environmental Impact Department
399 about drinking water. Commissioner Draper stated EID agreed to provide a presentation for
400 the Commissioners about various programs available to assist with water conservation. Chair
401 Powell reminded of plans to sponsor a water forum.
402

403 2. Ms. Taylor provided a status update on the Mexican Wolf Environmental Impact
404 Statement including actions to collect data, the posting of peer review comments on the
405 proposed rule revision, the consideration of revisions based on comments received, and the
406 plan for proposed meeting dates for the cooperating agency Interdisciplinary Project Team and
407 the EIS tribal working group.
408

409 3. Ms. Taylor discussed the current Lincoln County Ordinance 2007-2 which prohibits the
410 release into the wild, within the boundaries of Lincoln County, of predatory animals of the
411 genera Canis, Ursus, and Felis. Ms. Taylor noted the ordinance does not offer protections or
412 remedies as written and noted the Board of Commissioners had requested the Ordinance
413 amended. The Manager recommended a public hearing scheduled to consider and potentially
414 take action on a Wolf Ordinance. Ms. Taylor provided copies of similar ordinances enacted by
415 Luna County and Catron County.
416

417 Commissioner Doth discussed the need to include a remedy in the Ordinance. Attorney Morel
418 reminded there were federal rules and regulations applicable to any protected or endangered
419 species. Commissioner Stone stated support for amendment of the Ordinance and incorporation
420 of additional language from the ordinances developed by similarly affected counties.
421

422 There was a general consensus for Chair Powell, Commissioner Stone and Sheriff Sheppard to
423 work with the Attorney to provide recommendations on revisions to the existing Ordinance.
424

425 **16. Consideration of Approval of Required CDBG Policies by Resolution 2013-34**
426

427 Ms. Taylor reminded of the award of a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) in the
428 amount of \$500,000 to assist in the construction of a new Senior Center in Carrizozo. Ms.
429 Taylor stated acceptance of the grant required adoption of certain mandated federal and state
430 policies as follows:
431

447 **21. Consideration / Action of Indigent Health Care Claims**
448

449 Scott Annala, IHC Administrator presented the Sole Community Provider/Lincoln County
450 Medical Center claims for approval. Mr. Annala processed 68 claims with 66 recommended for
451 approval and 2 recommended for disapproval for a total authorization of \$118,159 and a year to
452 date authorization of \$817,090. Mr. Annala noted the average monthly hospital claims to date

453 was \$102,136 with a projected annual approval for FY 2013-2024 of approximately \$1.27
454 million.

455
456 Mr. Annala presented the Indigent Health Care Payments request for the month. Mr. Annala
457 processed 60 claims with 54 recommended for approval and 6 recommended for disapproval.
458 Mr. Annala stated the total of claims recommended for payment this month was \$9602.82 for a
459 year to date total of \$170,784. Mr. Annala noted the average monthly indigent claims to date
460 were \$21,348 with a projected annual expenditure of \$256,176. Mr. Annala reminded the FY
461 2013 -2014 budget for Indigent claims was \$393,278.

462
463 **Motion:** Approval and denial of the claims as indicated for Sole Community Provider and
464 Indigent Health Care Program payments as recommended. **Action:** Approve, **Moved by** Chair
465 Powell, **Seconded by** Commissioner Doth.

466 **Vote:** Motion carried by unanimous vote (**summary:** Yes = 5).

467 **Yes:** Chair Powell, Commissioner Minter, Commissioner Stone, Commissioner Doth,
468 Commissioner Draper.

469
470 Mr. Annala presented a flow chart detailing the current process for payment of the Sole
471 Community Provider obligation from the County to the State and the subsequent receipt and
472 disbursement of the federal match to the hospital.

473
474 Ms. Taylor confirmed under the current lease agreement with PHS any future payments to the
475 uncompensated care pool by the County to the State would be made from mill levy funds prior
476 to disbursement to LCMC.

477
478 Scott Annala discussed current bills moving through the State Legislature to support funding of
479 the uncompensated care pool and the expansion of Medicaid by obligating a particular GRT
480 match from the counties. Mr. Annala stated he would provide additional information regarding
481 whichever particular bill the legislature passed to clarify the Counties' obligation to the State
482 Human Services Department.

483

491 from the Village of Corona. Ms. Taylor presented a ten year agreement with a lease cost of
492 \$1.00 per year for the term of the lease and standard lease terms.

493
494 **Motion:** Approve the Cooperative Agreement and Lease of the Corona Senior Center, **Action:**

499
500 **23. Manager's Report**

501
502 **1. HATS OFF!**

- 503 a. The Manager commended Commissioner Kathryn Minter for earning her Certified
504 Public Official and NM Certified County Commissioner designations and Curt
505 Temple, Planning Director who earned his Certified Public Official designation. Both
506 designations were awarded in January through New Mexico State University's
507 certified NM EDGE Program.
- 508 b. The Manager also acknowledged the work of Carl Palmer, Road Superintendent and
509 members of the Road Department for their work on the Villa Madonna culvert project.
510 The Manager relayed words of appreciation from Steve McCloskey, of the US Forest
511 Service for the Road Department's work in supplying fill dirt for the project.
512
- 513 2. Other Training Initiatives. The Manager stated the County's newly formed "All Hazard
514 Incident Management Team" had attended the NIMS ICS All-Hazard Incident
515 Commander Course during the week of February 3rd in Salt Lake City. The Manager
516 stated the course was designed to provide local and state level emergency responders
517 with a robust understanding of the duties, responsibilities, and capabilities of an effective
518 Incident Commander (IC) on an All-Hazard Incident Management team. The Lincoln
519 County team attending the training consisted of the Incident Commander (IC) Spencer
520 Baldwin, Deputy IC Curt Temple, Logistics Section Chief Samantha Mendez and
521 Finance Lead Sherry Huddleston.
522
- 523 3. Workers Comp, Law Enforcement and Multi-Line Claims analysis. The Manager
524 stated she and Commissioner Minter met with the NMAC staff regarding Multi-Line,
525 Law Enforcement and Worker's Compensation Pools to understand what types of
526 claims were impacting Lincoln County.
527
- 528 Workers' Comp – Since 2004, the County had turned in 47 Workers'
529 Compensation claims to NMAC, with the payout for those claims totaling
530 \$1,355,620.42. During that timeline, the County's annual contribution into the pool
531 ranged from \$58k to \$90k with a loss ratio of 171.97%.
- 532 Multi-Line – Since 2004, the County had turned in 119 Multi-Line claims, which
533 include mainly auto, general liability and property, totaling \$1,834,555 with a loss
534 ratio over 5 years of 124.09%. Since 2009, the County's annual contribution into
535 the pool ranged from \$151k to \$207k.
- 536 Law Enforcement – since 2004, the County law enforcement claims totaled
537 \$507,390, claims being primarily for false arrest and breach of duty, with a loss
538 ratio for the past five years of 113.22%. During the past five years, the County's
539 annual contribution into the pool ranged from \$60k to \$75k.
540
- 541 The Manager stated the current goal was to have the loss ratios at 100% or less so the
542 County would pay into the various pools the same amount the pools were paying out
543 to cover our claims. The Manager expressed belief increased risk management
544 awareness would aid the County in reaching this goal.
545
- 546 4. Risk Awareness Program / Safety News. The Manager reminded that in September of
547 last year, the Commission approved the County's participation in the NMAC Risk
548 Awareness Program (RAP). Accordingly departmental RAP Representatives were
549 identified and are now responsible for conducting weekly safety meetings.
550 Departments participating include: Assessor, Treasurer, Clerk, Manager, Planning /
551 EOC, Road, Senior Centers and Sheriff's Office. The Manager stated in addition to a
552 scheduled weekly topic, the RAP Reps also incorporate recent county accidents into
553 the discussion. The RAP meetings have made employees aware of county policies

554 that need to be fine-tuned or significantly modified. The Manager expected
555 recommended changes affecting policies such as cell phone usage, reporting of an
556 accident, and the role and membership of the Accident Review Committee to be
557 presented to the Commission for consideration in the next few months.
558

- 559 5. Lincoln Slash Disposal. Gary Cozzens, Manager of NM State Lincoln Historic Site had
560 made the County aware of local efforts to work with the Bureau of Land Management
561 (BLM) to reconsider and establish a new slash disposal area in Lincoln. Chuck Schmidt
562 of the BLM informed several years ago, BLM fire staff worked with the Fire Chief of
563 Lincoln to develop a slash removal program as a cooperative project. The project was of
564 benefit to private landowners in the area and was funded by a BLM grant through the
565 NRCS RC&D program. The initial grant money allowed the local fire Chief to hire help to
566 assist the efforts to reduce the slash piles which had accumulated at the site. Although
567 the funding source eventually dried up, BLM and the Lincoln Fire Department attempted
568 to keep the site open. The site increased in popularity, with slash being brought in from
569 outside of Lincoln. Last year, BLM was forced to bring in a roll-off bin to remove debris
570 and made the decision to close the parking lot from slash disposal due to budget and
571 staffing. BLM's Fuel Specialist continues to work with the local community toward a
572 solution for slash disposal.
573

574 Commissioner Doth commented that during and after the Little Bear Fire when discussing slash
575 disposal no other agency seemed to be aware of this slash disposal site. Commissioner Doth
576 suggested exploring the possibility of seeking funding for other, similar slash disposal sites.
577

- 578 6. Legislative Update. The Manager reported on the passage of SB 268 related to funding
579 for hospitals and uncompensated care. The Manager explained the final language
580 requires a contribution from the County equivalent to 1/2th of the County's Indigent
581 Health Care GRT.
582
- 583 7. Living in the WUI. The collaborative outreach effort continues to provide information and
584 training to Lincoln County residents through its Speaker Series on Forest Health. The
585 next session titled "Ready, Set, Go and Emergency Response to Wildfire and Flooding"
586 was scheduled for March 4, 2014 and the Forest Health Expo was scheduled for April
587 11, 2014 at the Ruidoso Convention Center.
588
- 589 8. Departmental Updates.
590
- 591 a. Office of Emergency Services – Joe Kenmore, Director of OES informed there were
592 about six fires which started from "unattended" controlled burns in the last month.
593 Mr. Kenmore stated current conditions and erratic winds were proving problematic in
594 determining whether a burn ban should be declared in the County. Mr. Kenmore
595 stated as the Chair of the RAP program he acknowledged the need to reduce risk
596 and increase safety awareness.
597
- 598 b. Curt Temple, Planning Director discussed pending grant applications being
599 developed by Samantha Mendez of the department. Mr. Temple stated Rural
600 Addressing would be updating addressing information to the State. Mr. Temple
601 discussed the removal of A or B County Road signs to eliminate confusion with
602 actual named street signs.

603 Chair Powell reminded of the need for grant money to assist smaller entities with auditing costs
604 and requested the County be on the look-out for grants which might help our partner agencies.

605 Commissioner Stone suggested recent policies by the State Engineer would create a greater
606 need for other assistance for smaller water projects. Mr. Temple explained the State Engineer's
607 position to fund fewer projects to completion. Commissioner Stone objected to the State
608 Engineer's management of Water Trust Board Funds.

609
610 Chair Powell recessed the Regular Meeting at 11:58:21 AM and reconvened at 1:03:08 PM.

611
612 Chair Powell recessed the Regular Meeting and convened the Public Hearing at 1:03:31 PM.

644 adoption of the Ordinance landowners sought help in understanding how to access their private
645 property in the event their water crossings were washed out and they were unable to restore the
646 crossing due to the burden of regulations imposed by the Ordinance and FEMA regulations.

647
648 Bill Borthwick, State Flood Plain Coordinator and Certified Flood Plain Manager explained the
649 State of NM had 100 National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) communities which participate
650 in the program so residents might obtain low cost flood insurance. Mr. Borthwick discussed the
651 impact of recent post fire floods and other cascading events such as wind, drought and fire
652 which had cost the State of New Mexico approximately \$443 million dollars in damage since
653 2000. Mr. Borthwick noted costs of flood damage were driving a more decisive policy regarding
654 flood plain management decreasing emphasis on flood insurance and increasing emphasis on
655 preventative measures and compliance with regulations.

204 Department of Finance (DFA) a First Amendment to the Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) for the
205 Financing and Establishment of the Otero County/Lincoln County Regional Landfill was
206 prepared and submitted to DFA for approval to allow for the disbursement of the excess funds.
207

208 Ms. Taylor stated DFA returned the First Amendment and informed an amendment required
209 formal approval by all members of the JPA individually. Ms. Taylor stated nine of the twelve



WHEREAS, the legislature did not apply the requirements imposed under the 1989 amendment of Section 73-20-46 to resolutions providing for annual levies under the previous law; and

WHEREAS, said referendum was conducted in accordance with provisions of the Soil and Water Conservation District Act [73-20-25 to 73-20-48 NMSA 1978] previous to the 1989 amendment; and

WHEREAS, this resolution shall not become effective until approved in writing by the New Mexico Soil & Water Conservation Commission;

NOW THEREFORE, on this March 10, 2014 Board of Supervisors of the Chaves Soil & Water Conservation District being in session in accordance with the Open Meetings Act, a quorum being present, and following public discussion does hereby resolve to establish a mill levy at the rate of one dollar per thousand dollars of net taxable value of real property within the District for the 2014/2015 tax year.





Discussion: During its February 8, 2013 meeting, the Commission heard a proposal by Planning Director Curt Temple to seek a planning grant for the purpose of developing a Land Development Ordinance. This Ordinance would aid in the management of developments within previously approved but undeveloped subdivisions, and would also apply to those parcels created by claims of exemption. Mr. Temple subsequently reported to the Commission that the County was unable to attain the grant due to the median income level in the county. Although the full development of such an ordinance would require significant investment of time and resources, research could be initiated and an initial document drafted by the Lincoln County Planning Commission. Mr. Curt Temple and Mr. Tom Mann, member of the Planning Commission will be present at the Commission meeting to provide additional information and answer questions.

Recommendation: Direct the Planning Commission to commence conducting research and drafting the Lincoln County Land Development Ordinance.





This is notification that the **2014 Annual Certified County Maintained Mileage Report is due on April 1st, 2014.** Pursuant to NMSA 1978, Section 66-6-23 (1999), which states, the Board of County Commissioners of each county shall certify and submit an Annual Certified County Maintained Mileage Report to the Secretary of the Department of Transportation, on or before April 1st of each year.

By July 1st of every year, representatives for the Secretary of the Department of Transportation shall verify the submittal of each county and revise, if necessary, the total mileage of public roads maintained by each county. The mileage acknowledged by these representatives, shall be the official mileage of the public roads maintained by each county and will be reported to the New Mexico State Treasurer's Office. After August 1st, distribution of funding to each county for road maintenance purposes shall be made in accordance with the aforementioned NMSA section.

Pursuant to NMSA 1978, Section 67-3-28.3 (1988), any county not complying with the required certified submittal by April 1st of each year, will have their mileage estimated and then reduced by one-third each month for that fiscal year, by the Secretary of the Department of Transportation. The amount of mileage deducted from the counties not in compliance, shall be equally distributed between all counties in compliance, by the Secretary of the Department of Transportation.

Please submit a complete set of information, correctly labeled and identified which contains the following:

- 1) A fully attributed Geographic Information System (GIS) data set identifying certified county maintained road features with mileage information on CD. I am writing this letter as the Manager of the Lincoln Historic Site to support the request of the newly formed Lincoln Merchant's group request for funding to print a brochure.



The Iris Farm

The Hondo Iris Farm is one of Lincoln County’s main tourist attractions.

The Hondo Iris Farm is one of New Mexico’s most beautiful gardens. Admission is free, and the garden is open to the public for enjoyment without obligation to make a purchase. The garden features 500 varieties of prize winning iris (that bloom in May), a botanical garden with labeled, cold hearty desert plants and trees, a gold fish pond where children can feed fish, a rose garden, a “hummingbird porch” and ample benches and tables for picnicking and enjoying the surroundings.

During the busiest season, including May, the farm employs six local residents, all of whom are able to explain items in the garden and carry out both greeter and educational functions.

The farm also has a gallery in a 150 year old adobe building, once owned by Sheriff Pat Brady. The gallery sells plants, seeds, clothing, locally made jewelry, and it has a collection of folk art from around the world.

Visitors to the Iris Farm

Last year over 4500 people visited the farm. 800-1000 visitors normally visit on Mothers’ Day. Last year, paying customers came from 23 states and 154 cities, many from out of state. The majority of out of town visitors came from New Mexico, some from as far away as Farmington. (See attached list of cities and states of people who actually bought Iris.) We estimate that only one out of three visitors actually makes a purchase at the farm, the others take advantage of the beautiful garden and gallery.

Each year, bus loads of visitors arrive at the farm, including tour busses on special tours to the area, a bus load from UNM in Albuquerque, and busses carrying visitors from area nursing homes and elementary schools. Photographers, painters, and gardening groups from as far away as Carlsbad and Las Cruces, frequent the farm.

The Iris Farm web site is one of the most popular sites visited by prospective tourists to the area. A tracking of people who click on the Hondo Iris Farm web site from out of town, when planning their vacation, shows that over 3500 visitors went to www.hondoirisfarm.com last year. Most visited the site when they were either deciding whether to visit Ruidoso or to actually plan their itinerary. (Source: Google tracking). During January 2014, for example, 226 visitors went to the site from 31 states. (See Google analytics for December, 2013, attached.)

The web site includes links to Lincoln County places to stay: the Ellis Store, La Rinconada, the San Patricio Retreat, and the Smokey Bear Motel. Visitors to the web site are also referred to the “Lodging” sections of Ruidoso.net and Ruidoso.com.

The Hondo Iris Farm is one of the most frequented sites clicked on at www.Ruidoso.net "Area Attractions" and "Outdoor Activities."

Present Advertising

Last year we spent \$2857.00 on local advertising. Most was focused on bringing visitors to the farm in May during the "Hondo Iris Festival. The farm advertises in the Ruidoso News, in the Roswell Daily News, New Mexico Travel Magazine, and sometimes in New Mexico Magazine. The present newspaper reach includes Ruidoso, Alamogordo, Las Cruces, Deming, Roswell, Artesia, and Carlsbad.

The Iris Farm distributes brochures all summer through Southwest Advertising. Southwest advertising has brochure racks in motels, restaurants, time shares, and other businesses in Lincoln County, Ruidoso and Alamogordo. Last year more than 3000 brochures were actually picked up. Most of the area time shares recommend the Iris Farm in their orientation talks and motel registrars and restaurant owners also recommend the farm.

Mothers' Day is the big event at the farm, with free live music and a special welcome for mothers. Consequently, Mothers' Day advertising includes large page, print advertising and press releases (for the past ten years, the Ruidoso News has carried a front page cover edition about the iris farm in Vamanos.)

Proposed Advertising with Lodgers' Tax Funds

We propose a month long, state-wide television and internet campaign to expand the audience for the iris farm and attract more out of town visitors to Lincoln County in May

We know from interviews, that visitors are willing to plan a special trip to visit the farm, and Ruidoso, from as far away as Santa Fe, Albuquerque, and even Farmington. Many spend several days in Lincoln County and visit the rest of the sights.

The expansion of television and internet advertising will include advertising targeted to women who listen to daytime television programs on Comcast Cable television. (See map of Comcast cities and the number of subscribers in each city.)

We propose eighty, 30 second ads to run from April 28th to May 25th, during the day on Fox News, Headline News, and the Lifetime Channel (the highest women viewership stations.) The TV ad will be produced by Comcast and will include a series of photographs of the Iris Farm, a short written narrative, and a voice over. The ads will emphasize the fantastic Iris bloom in May with a special emphasis on Mothers' Day and refer listeners to the Hondo iris Farm web site. The site gives particulars about the farm, the hours, and directions. (The reach will be statewide, see attached map of Comcast Cities.)

This advertising will place the Iris Farm alongside the race track, Sierra Blanca, and The Inn of the Mountain Gods, as the tourist attractions that advertise on state-wide television. The expectation is that over time, this advertising will double the number of out of town visitors to the Iris Farm and have a marked effect on tourism in Lincoln County during May. The effect of

the advertising will be partially measured by the increase in traffic to the Iris Farm website as measured by a special program that google offers. Visitors will be physically counted during May to measure any increase in farm traffic. The effect on lodging in Lincoln County will only be indirectly measured by analyzing the number of visitors to the site who click on our lodging page.

In addition to the television ads, Comcast has over two hundred fifty thousand subscribers to its internet site (XFINITY). Comcast will include 85,000 ads on its internet site for the Iris Farm. Anyone who clicks on the ad will see the television commercial and, alternatively, can go from their internet ad to the Hondo Iris Farm web site.

Purpose: Consideration / Approval of Payment of Prior Year's Invoice

Discussion:

In January, 2014, the County received an invoice for \$696.71 from CenturyLink for a 911 ADE Full Database Extract of 13,116 units. The data is extracted once a year, in June, to update the E911 data base for the County's Code Red program. The County was late in receiving this invoice due to it being issued to the Village of Ruidoso first. The Manager nor the Finance Department, Sheriff's Department and Office of Emergency Services were aware of this contract and this required data extraction. We have confirmed that the data is essential to maintaining an accurate data base for our Code Red service.

Steps have been taken to ensure the County receives accurate and timely billing in the future.

Recommendation: Approve for immediate payment the prior year's invoice for \$696.71 to Lincoln County from CenturyLink.

**QWEST 911 ALI DATABASE EXTRACT AGREEMENT
GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

1. Definitions. As used herein:

"ALI Database Information" means ALI listings that are stored by Qwest for the purpose of provisioning and delivering Emergency Services.

"Automatic Location Identification" or "ALI" means a feature by which the address and name associated with a telephone number ("TN") are forwarded to a Public Safety Entity for display.

"Cause" means the failure of a party to perform a material obligation under this Agreement which failure is not remedied, if curable: (a) for payment defaults by Customer, upon five calendar days written notice, or (b) for any other general default, upon 30 calendar days written notice.

"Confidential Information" means any information that is not generally available to the public, whether of a technical, business, or other nature and that: (a) the receiving party knows or has reason to know is confidential, proprietary, or trade secret information of the disclosing party; and/or (b) is of such a nature that the receiving party should reasonably understand that the disclosing party desires to protect such information against unrestricted disclosure. Confidential information will not include information that is in the public domain through no breach of this Agreement by the receiving party or is already known or is independently developed by the receiving party.

"Emergency Services" means 911 emergency services and Emergency Notification Services.

"Emergency Notification Services" means services that notify the public of an emergency.

"Emergency Support Services" means information or database management services which support Emergency Services.

"Intellectual Property" means all trademarks, trade names, logos, domain names, service marks, copyrights, copyright registrations, patents, patent applications, trade secrets and any other intellectual property whether existing upon the Effective Date or arising thereafter.

"Public Safety Entity" means any PSAP or government agency involved in providing emergency services.

"Public Service Answering Point" or "PSAP" means the answering location for 911 calls.

"Resident" means the persons and entities whose information resides in the ALI database.

"Service" means the Qwest service described in Exhibit A.

"Software" means software (including third-party software) or other digital content or material and related documentation, if any, provided by Qwest to Customer in connection with the Service.

"Special Data Extraction" will mean the creation of an output record or informational report (from existing data files) that is not created in the normal course of business.

2. Provision of Service. Subject to payment of all applicable charges, Qwest will use commercially reasonable efforts to provide the Service set forth in Exhibit A. The Service is provisioned by Qwest and/or through its applicable affiliates, subcontractors and vendors. Service will be supplied in accordance with this Agreement. Customer understands that Qwest's performance under this Agreement is dependent in part on Customer and third parties, including without limitation, suppliers. Accordingly, any performance to be rendered by Qwest

hereunder will be appropriately waived or delayed to account for actions or inactions by such third parties.

3. Intellectual Property. Nothing in this Agreement will be construed as granting Customer any right, title, interest, or license in or to any of Qwest's Intellectual Property and Customer cannot use any of Qwest's Intellectual Property without Qwest's prior written consent. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Qwest grants Customer access to ALI Database Information solely for purposes of delivering, or assisting in the delivery of, Emergency Services, as set forth in 47 USC § 222(g) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended.

4. Service, Rates and Terms. Exhibit A specifies the description, rates, charges, and other terms applicable to the Service. The rates do not include Taxes.

5. Payment. Customer must pay Qwest all charges by the payment due date on the invoice. Any amount not paid when due will be subject to interest at the lesser of 1½% per month or the highest rate permitted by applicable law. Customer must also pay Qwest any applicable federal, state, and local taxes, surcharges, and other similar charges ("Taxes") assessed in connection with Customer's Service. Taxes are subject to change. Qwest may reasonably modify the payment terms or require other assurance of payment based on Customer's payment history or a material and adverse change in Customer's financial condition.

6. Conditions of Service.

6.1 Qwest will retain all right, title, interest and ownership in and to the ALI Database Information it provides hereunder.

6.2 Customer will take commercially reasonable and prudent measures to protect the privacy of the Resident information contained within the ALI Database and prevent disclosure and unauthorized use of ALI Database Information. Such measures will be at least equal to the measures Customer takes to protect its own confidential and proprietary information, including without limitation, implementing adequate computer security measures to prevent unauthorized access to ALI Database Information when contained in any database.

6.3 Customer will not sublicense, sell, copy or allow any third party to access, download, copy or use the ALI Database Information, in any form, or any portions or derivatives thereof, or any information extracted therefrom, except as necessary to enable a vendor contracted by Customer to maintain and make accessible the emergency system and Emergency Services for which Service has been purchased. Customer will require such vendor's compliance with the general terms and conditions of the Agreement, which will be incorporated into an agreement between Customer and such vendor. Customer will be fully liable to Qwest for such vendor's compliance with the terms and conditions of the Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Parties understand that third persons may claim that Confidential Information, including without limitation, ALI Database Information, delivered to Customer under the Agreement may be, by virtue of its possession by Customer, a public record and subject to disclosure. The Parties agree that in the event such a claim is made, Customer will immediately notify Qwest of the claim, and Qwest will, at its cost, defend and hold harmless Customer and its officers and employees from any such claim.

Customer, in consideration thereof, will not disclose any such Confidential Information in response to any such claim until a final unappealable order from a court or agency having authority to issue such order will have been issued. Any such disclosure will be the minimum necessary to comply with such order. Except as described above, Customer will be liable to Qwest for any intentional disclosure, in whole or part, of Confidential Information provided to it hereunder by Qwest. Qwest may "seed" or specially code some or all of the ALI Database Information in order to trace such information and ensure compliance with the disclosure and use restrictions set forth in this Agreement.

6.4 Within five days after the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement, Customer will: (a) return and cease using any and all ALI Database Information which it has in its possession or control; (b) extract and expunge any and all copies of such ALI Database Information, any portions thereof, and any and all information extracted therefrom, from its files and records, whether in print or electronic form or in any other media whatsoever; and (c) provide a written certification to Qwest from Customer's officer that all of the foregoing actions have been completed.

6.5 Customer represents that it is a provider of Emergency Services or Emergency Support Services and agrees that it will remain such a provider throughout the Term.

7. **Covenants of Parties.** Qwest agrees that it will make commercially reasonable efforts to ensure that the ALI Database Information that it provides to Customer hereunder will be generally complete and accurate. Customer understands that Qwest has no responsibility to update the ALI Database Information of other local service providers. Customer may, at its option, require Qwest to correct any mutually-agreed deficiencies in its work product or services within a mutually agreeable time period, at no cost to Customer, except when such deficiencies relate to ALI Database Information of other local service providers.

8. **Term.** This Agreement will effective as of the Effective Date, but the Term of Service will start on the Start of Service Date and continue for the Term selected in Exhibit A in Section 3(e), "Term; Extract Frequency" (the "Initial Term"). The "Start of Service Date" is the date the first extract is pulled. After the expiration of the Initial Term, this Agreement will automatically renew for consecutive renewal periods equal to the Initial Term ("Renewal Term") unless terminated by either party as provided in Section 9, "Termination". Any extensions will be collectively referred to as the "Term"

9. **Termination.** Qwest may (a) immediately suspend all or any part of the Service, and/or (b) terminate this Agreement (effective after the applicable notice period): (i) for Cause or (ii) upon written notice if Customer becomes or is declared insolvent or bankrupt or is the subject of any proceedings related to its liquidation, insolvency or for the appointment of a receiver or similar officer for it. Customer may terminate this Agreement for Cause. If Customer terminates this Agreement for Cause prior to the conclusion of the Term, then Customer will remain liable for charges accrued but unpaid as of the termination date. CUSTOMER'S EXCLUSIVE REMEDIES FOR ANY AND ALL CLAIMS RELATED TO THE SERVICE WILL BE LIMITED TO THE TOTAL RECURRING CHARGE PAID OR PAYABLE BY CUSTOMER TO QWEST FOR SERVICE IN THE MONTH IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE OCCURRENCE OF THE EVENT GIVING RISE TO THE CLAIM. QWEST'S TOTAL AGGREGATE LIABILITY RELATED TO THIS AGREEMENT WILL NOT EXCEED THE TOTAL RECURRING CHARGES PAID OR PAYABLE BY CUSTOMER TO QWEST PURSUANT TO THIS AGREEMENT IN THE MONTH IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE OCCURRENCE OF THE EVENT GIVING RISE TO THE CLAIM. THIS LIMITATION OF LIABILITY IN THIS SECTION WILL NOT APPLY TO CUSTOMER'S PAYMENT AND INDEMNIFICATION OBLIGATIONS.

14. Dispute Resolution.

14.1 Governing Law; Forum. This Agreement will be governed by the laws of the state of Colorado, except with regard to matters which are within the exclusive jurisdiction of the state or federal regulatory agency. Those matters alone will be governed by the laws of the appropriate jurisdiction. Any legal proceeding relating to this Agreement will be brought in a U.S. District Court, or absent federal jurisdiction, in a state court of competent jurisdiction, in the location of the party to this Agreement not initiating the action, as indicated in the Notices section. But Qwest may, at its discretion, initiate proceedings in Denver, Colorado to collect undisputed amounts billed. This provision is not intended to deprive a small claims court or state agency of lawful jurisdiction that would otherwise exist over a claim or controversy between the parties.

14.2 Waiver of Jury Trial and Class Action. Each party, to the extent permitted by law, knowingly, voluntarily, and intentionally waives its right to a jury trial and any right to pursue any claim or action relating to this Agreement on a class or consolidated basis or in a representative capacity.

15. Miscellaneous.

15.1 Relationship. The relationship of the parties is that of independent contractor. Neither party will have the authority to bind the other by contract or otherwise or make any representations or guarantees on behalf of the other. The relationship arising from this Agreement does not constitute an agency, joint venture, partnership, employee relationship or franchise.

15.2 Assignment. Customer may not assign this Agreement or any of its rights or obligations hereunder without the prior written consent of Qwest, which consent will not be unreasonably withheld.

15.3 Survival. All terms and provisions of this Agreement which should by their nature survive the termination of this Agreement will so survive.

15.4 Waiver. Neither party's failure to insist upon strict performance of any provision of this Agreement will be construed as a waiver of any of its rights hereunder.

15.5 Severability. If any term of this Agreement is held unenforceable, the unenforceable term will be construed as nearly as possible to reflect the original intent of the parties and the remaining terms will remain in effect.

15.6 Notices. Unless otherwise provided herein, all required notices to Qwest will be in writing, transmitted to the parties' addresses specified in the Signature Page or such other addresses as may be specified in writing, and will be considered given either: (a) when delivered in person to the recipient named on the Signature Page; (b) three business days after mailed via regular U.S. Mail; (c) when delivered via overnight courier mail; or (d) when delivered by fax if duplicate notice is also sent by regular U.S. Mail.

15.7 Authorization. Customer represents and warrants that: (a) the full legal name of the legal entity intended to receive the benefits and Service under this Agreement is accurately set forth herein; and (b) the execution hereof is not in conflict with law, the terms of any charter or bylaw, or any agreement to which Customer is bound or affected. Qwest may act in reliance upon any instruction or signature reasonably believed by Qwest to be genuine. Customer agrees that any employee of Customer who gives any written notice or other instruction in connection with this Agreement has the authority to do so.

15.8 Third-Party Beneficiaries. This Agreement is intended solely for Qwest and its affiliates and Customer and not to benefit any other person or entity.

15.9 Force Majeure. Neither party will be liable for any delay or failure to perform its obligations hereunder if such delay or failure is caused by an unforeseeable event beyond the reasonable control of a party, including without limitation: act of God, fire, flood, labor strikes; sabotage, fiber cuts, acts of terror, material shortages or unavailability, government laws or regulations, war or civil disorder, or failures of suppliers of goods and services.

16. Entire Agreement. This Agreement, including Exhibit A, constitutes the entire agreement between Customer and Qwest and supersedes all prior oral or written agreements or understandings. All amendments to this Agreement will be in writing and signed by the parties' authorized representatives. Each party reserves the right to reject any handwritten change to this Agreement.

EXHIBIT A

Qwest 911 ADE Product Description

This Exhibit A to the Qwest 911 ALI Database Extract Agreement (the "Agreement") sets forth the description of the Qwest 911 ALI Database Extract ("Qwest 911 ADE").

1. DEFINITIONS

Except as otherwise set forth herein, capitalized terms shall have the definitions assigned to them in the Agreement.

"Emergency Number Service Provider" or "ENSP" means any entity involved in any aspect of providing services in support of 911.

"Emergency Service Number" or "ESN" means the routing number that directs the 911 call to the appropriate PSAP.

"Listing" means one name, address, and TN.

"Master Street Address Guide" or "MSAG" means the listing of all existing addresses in a community that is maintained by the local addressing authority.

"Region" means the applicable county, city, or ESN as defined in the MSAG.

"Subscriber" means a local service customer of Qwest or other carrier whose ALI Database Information is included in the Service.

2. DESCRIPTION

The Service extracts Subscriber listed and unlisted (including unpublished) information in its possession and delivers it to Customer solely for purposes of delivering, or assisting in the delivery, of Emergency Services.

The Service offers full database downloads for the selected Region, and daily updates containing only the Subscriber data records for the selected Region that have been modified since the most recent extraction. Each of the extracts requires the selection of unique criteria in order for the extract to be executed properly. This Exhibit A identifies the required criteria for each extract.

3. DETAILED SERVICE INFORMATION

Customer defines the format, frequency and data sets during account setup. A user ID and a password-protected means of extract retrieval are also established during account setup.

(a) File Format

Qwest will format files compliant with either of the following:

- NENA 2 512 byte format.
- World Wide Web Consortium's XML 1.0 specification for XML formatted files.
- ENSP fixed width data file.

(b) File Naming

- File names conform to an 8-character, no suffix naming convention.

(c) Data Sort Order

- Files are sequenced by a single header record followed by zero or more data records, and conclude with a single trailer record.
- Full database download records are sorted in ascending sequence by TN.
- Update download records are also sorted in ascending sequence by TN. Only the final disposition of any record that changes between downloads is reported. Customer's system must interpret function codes such as the receipt of an update record where no insert previously existed.
- A file without data records indicates no content is available for the selected Region and extract type.

(d) Geographic Area Extract Selection Criteria

The following primary geographic selection criteria are available (as defined in the applicable MSAG):

- Community/Municipality name
- County/Parish name; and
- ESN and Entity (combined)

(e) **Term; Extract Frequency.** Qwest 911 ADE downloads and updates are available as follows: Full record downloads are available monthly, quarterly, yearly and on demand. Full downloads include records that may not have changed since the last download. Changed record downloads are only available daily or monthly. Customer selects the following Term and Extract Frequency by checking the applicable box below.

(f) Notification of Extracted Data File Availability

- For an additional charge, Customer may request to be notified via email when a file is available for download. The charges for this option are set forth in Section 4, below.

(g) Extract Data File Retention on File Server

- Extracted data files are stored on the file server for no more than fourteen (14) calendar days from the date of extract, and no backup data files are maintained.

(h) Distribution Method for Extracted Data Files

- Extract files are not sent to Customer.
- Customer connects to the file server specified by Qwest to download (pull) its extract files. This is for extract files containing less than 10,000 records. Extract files containing 10,000 or more records will be sent in the form of a compact disk ("CD").
- Customer is provided a secure, specific partition within the file server which is required for changed record downloads.
- Customer uses a dial-up connection to retrieve data files from its pre-designated file server location.
- Customer may access the file server only to download its own files.
- File transmissions may utilize file compression technology.



SUBJECT: Resolution No. 2013-36: Memorial Supporting Local Water Management By Acequias in New Mexico and Commemorating the Twenty-Fifth Anniversary of the New Mexico Acequia Association

Purpose: Consideration / Adoption of Resolution No. 2013-36

Discussion: In the Fifty-First Legislature, 2nd Session, 2014, Senate Memorial 57 was introduced by Senator Carlos R. Cisneros and was passed by the Legislature. County Resolution 2013-36 adopts this key piece of legislation that, among other things, recognizes the following:

- the water management capabilities by Acequias in New Mexico;
- that Acequias are a centuries-old form of water governance in New Mexico and are recognized as political subdivisions of the State that are responsible for the management of many of the surface water rights on their respective rivers and streams;
- Acequias contribute to the well-being and livelihood of tens of thousands of families who irrigate from an estimated eight hundred Acequias;
- Acequias enhance the natural process of aquifer recharge by slowing and spreading mountain runoff through an intricate network of waterways that support river flows and riparian habitats, and have a positive effect on the hydrology of lower reaches of watersheds;
- The Interstate Stream Commission and the State Engineer are requested to continue to work with leadership from the NM Acequia Association to expand investment in Acequia irrigation infrastructure and to facilitate the involvement of Acequias in regional water planning. (see enclosure 1 for Resolution 2013-36).

Recommendation: Consider / adopt Resolution 2013-36.

A MEMORIAL
SUPPORTING LOCAL WATER MANAGEMENT BY ACEQUIAS IN
NEW MEXICO AND COMMEMORATING THE TWENTY-FIFTH
ANNIVERSARY OF THE NEW MEXICO ACEQUIA ASSOCIATION

WHEREAS, acequias and community ditches in New Mexico have created a cultural landscape and way of life centered around local agriculture, water governance and customs of sharing scarce water; and

WHEREAS, Acequias are a centuries-old form of water governance in New Mexico, are recognized as political subdivisions of the State and are responsible for the management of many of the surface water rights on their respective rivers and streams; and

WHEREAS, in many rural, unincorporated communities, Acequias are an important, and in some instances the only, form of local government; and

WHEREAS, acequias contribute to the well-being and livelihood of tens of thousands of families who irrigate from an estimated eight hundred acequias; and

WHEREAS, according to hydrological research, acequias enhance the natural process of aquifer recharge by slowing and spreading mountain runoff through and intricate network of waterways that support river flows and riparian habitats; and

WHEREAS, while acequias have a positive effect on the hydrology of lower reaches of watersheds, they depend on healthy forests in the upper watersheds to generate clean water for rivers and streams; and

WHEREAS, acequias and community ditches face many challenges related to long-term water scarcity and drought, demands to transfer water rights out of agriculture to other uses, adjudication of water rights and the need for investment in irrigation infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, acequias and community ditches come together in the past four decades to form several regional associations and, twenty-five years ago, established a statewide membership organization, the New Mexico Acequia Association, NMAA, to protect and defend acequias and to work toward a common vision for the future; and

WHEREAS, some of the policy accomplishments of acequia leaders over the past few decades include the creation of the Acequia and Community Ditch Fund, the Acequia Construction Program and cost-share funding at the Interstate Stream Commission and the creation of the Governor-appointed Acequia Commission; and

WHEREAS, acequia leadership through the NMAA also contributed to the passage of new laws strengthening acequia governance, including Acequia Authority to regulate water transfers and to administer acequia water banking as well as laws strengthening acequia

enforcement powers regarding easements and illegal uses of water; and

WHEREAS, the NMAA and its partners have contributed to efforts to support children, youths and young adults to become stewards of acequia knowledge and practice through community education projects and have started a process to develop curricula with acequia-related themes for public schools that are aligned with educational requirements; and

WHEREAS, acequia leadership has called upon the State Engineer, who administers water rights in New Mexico, to affirm its historic role in local water management and to work collaboratively to allocate water as fairly and equitably as possible; and

WHEREAS, as water scarcity has intensified with long-term drought, acequias have developed seasonal water-sharing agreements with the support of the State Engineer in certain areas, but much work remains in other areas to involve local acequia officials in water management decisions; and

WHEREAS, as demands increase for water rights, acequias and community ditches will be under greater pressure with regard to transfers of water rights out of agriculture to other uses and will have the authority to regulate such transfers in consideration of whether such transfers are detrimental to the acequia or its members; and

WHEREAS, because of their unique role in water allocation and in making decisions about water transfers, acequias are important policymakers at the local level and vital partners to the State in water administration by the State Engineer and Regional Water Planning by the Interstate Stream Commission; and

WHEREAS, acequias throughout the State are working in close collaboration with the Interstate Stream Commission, the Natural Resource Conservation Service and local Soil and Water Conservation Districts to restore, rehabilitate and upgrade historic irrigation works to support the continued growth of the agricultural economy to meet the demand for locally grown food;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, Lincoln County Board of Commissioners that acequias and community ditches be recognized for their unique contributions to the culture, history, hydrology, ecology and agricultural economy of the State of New Mexico; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the New Mexico Acequia Association be congratulated on its Twenty-Fifth Anniversary and its ongoing work to strengthen local acequias, protect acequia-based water rights, support acequia-grown foods, support the engagement of youth through educational projects and curricula and encouragement of new generations of leadership in acequias and community ditches; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Lincoln County Board of Commissioners recognize the ongoing work by the State Engineer to work with acequias in certain areas of New Mexico and urges the State Engineer to expand efforts to collaborate with local acequia elected officials and support their unique role in local water governance and management; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Interstate Stream Commission and the State Engineer be requested to continue to work with leadership from the New Mexico Acequia Association to expand investment in acequia irrigation infrastructure and to facilitate the involvement of acequias in regional water planning; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the Office of the State Engineer, the Interstate Stream Commission, and the New Mexico Acequia Association, the Acequia Commission and the Governor.



SUBJECT: Federal Water Rights Protection Act H.R. 3189

Purpose: Consideration / Direct Support of Water Rights Protection Act

Discussion: H.R. 3189 would prevent a recent directive for federal agencies to require certain entities to relinquish their water rights to the United States in order to use public lands. The directive is currently applicable to ski areas specifically, however broad concern exists that this issue is a threat to all water users, including ranchers, as they depend on these rights to keep their businesses viable. Rep. Tipton, who sponsored the bill, said the bill was needed because it “provides critical protection for water rights’ holders from federal takings by ensuring that federal government agencies cannot extort private property rights through uneven-handed negotiations. Tipton argued that the bill “prohibits federal agencies from pilfering water rights through the use of permits, leases and other land management arrangements, for which it would otherwise have to pay just compensation under the 5th Amendment of the Constitution”.¹ See Enclosure for copy of H.R. 3189 and Enclosure 2 for letter of Support from the Public Lands Council and the National Cattlemen’s Beef Association.

Recommendation: Direct Manager to write letter of support for H.R. 3189 to the Honorable Doc Hastings, Chairman of the House Committee on Natural Resources and The Honorable Peter DeFazio, Ranking Member, as well as the full NM Congressional delegation.

Dear Chairman Hastings and Ranking Member DeFazio:

The Public Lands Council (PLC) and the National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA) strongly support the *Water Rights Protection Act* (WRPA), (H.R. 3189). PLC is the only national organization dedicated solely to representing the roughly 22,000 ranchers who operate on federal lands, some of which are U.S. Forest Service (USFS) lands. NCBA is the beef industry's largest and oldest national marketing and trade association, representing American cattlemen and women who provide much of the nation's supply of food and own or manage a large portion of America's private property. Many of our members also hold private water rights on federal lands, which serve as an integral part of their operations; thus, these water rights keep our members in business and rural communities thriving. However, landowners face an unprecedented threat to the future of their water rights on lands managed by the USFS.

H.R. 3189, introduced by Congressmen: Scott Tipton (R-Colo.), Mark Amodei (R-Nev.), Rob Bishop (R-Utah), Tom McClintock (R-Calif.), and Jared Polis (D-Colo.) comes as a means to combat the recent directive that allows the USFS to execute the seizure of these water rights without just compensation. The language in the directive is applicable to ski areas specifically; however, this issue is a threat to all water users, including ranchers, as they depend on these rights to keep their businesses viable. It is important H.R. 3189 pass without limitation to specific industries—ensuring ranchers have access to the water rights they have developed.

We understand that an amendment may be offered in tomorrow's markup that would cause the legislation to become applicable only to ski operations. NCBA and PLC strongly oppose any amendment with exclusive language that will jeopardize the efficacy of the bill for our constituency, western ranchers. Our members face the same threats as ski companies do—perhaps, with more at stake, as they are individuals and families depending on these water rights for their livelihood. It is important to include all industries that may be impacted in the legislation, to keep our rural communities thriving. Rep. Tipton's bill accomplishes the purpose of protecting all water right holders, including ranchers. There is no justification to include an amendment that will only protect one type of water use, and we strongly urge all members of the committee to vote against any such amendment.

We thank you for your attention to this crucial issue, and for supporting our members as they continue to be an essential part of rural communities and stewards of our public lands.



SUBJECT: Sole Community Provider & Indigent Health Care Claims

Purpose: To obtain the approval from the IHC Board of Sole Community Provider Payments, and the Indigent Health Care (IHC) Payments.

Discussion:

Sole Community Provider Payments: This month our coordinator processed forty (40) claims, thirty-seven (37) of which are recommended for approval, and three (3) for disapproval for the reasons indicated at Enclosure 1. If approved, the total recommended payment this month is **\$72,410.37**. See Enclosure. 1.

Indigent Health Care Claims: This month our coordinator processed forty-four (44) claims. Thirty-five (35) are recommended for approval, and nine (9) for disapproval for the reason indicated at Enclosure 2. If approved, total recommended for payment this month is **\$10,259.85**. At Enclosure 2 is a summary of total applications approved and denied. At Enclosure 3 is the summary of the Indigent Fund Meeting for March and the Year-To-Date that each lists the applications by provider.

Manager's Analysis – For the last two years, the average Indigent Health Care monthly payments were **\$21,651** and **\$24,262** respectively. The FY 12-13 year-end total was **\$291,140.11**. Our budget for FY13 - 14 is \$393,278. To date, the total expenditure is \$181,043.66 or an average of \$20,115.96 monthly.

Similarly, for the last two fiscal years, the total Commission-approved Sole Community Provider Claims were **\$1,201,132** and **\$1,371,890** respectively. The FY 12-13 monthly average was **\$114,324.16**. To date, the total expenditure is \$889,600.32, with a monthly average of \$98,844.48

Recommendation: Approve and disapprove the claims as indicated for the Sole Community Provider report at Enclosure 1 and the Indigent Health Care Program report as indicated at Enclosure 2.



SUBJECT: Manager's Report

1. **Smokey Bear Ranger District.** Acting Smokey Bear District Forester, Larry Cordova, reported that the remodel of their Ruidoso Ranger Station is near completion. They intend to have a "soft grand opening" in April and a very formal grand opening on Smokey Bear's 70th birthday on August 9th. They will keep us posted on these activities. Their hot shot crew of 20 is scheduled to arrive this week. District Ranger Dave Warnack is on special assignment in Flagstaff, Az., and looks forward to bringing his learnings back to Lincoln County to share with all partners, and towards seeking ability to implement new fire and flood mitigation processes.

2. **EPA Revised "New Source Performance Standards (NSPS) for new residential wood heaters".** EPA is revising the new Source performance Standards (NSPS) for new residential wood heaters. This action is necessary (per the EPS) because it updates the 1988 NSPS to reflect significant advancements in wood heater technologies and design, broadens the range of residential wood-heating appliances covered by the regulation and improves and streamlines implementation procedures. This rule is expected to require manufacturers to redesign wood heaters to be cleaner and lower-emitting. In general, the design changes would also make the heaters perform better and be more efficient. The revisions are also expected to streamline the process for testing new model lines by allowing the use of International Standards Organization (ISO)-accredited laboratories and certifying bodies, which will expand the number of facilities than can be used for testing and certification of the new model lines. These standards would apply only to new residential wood heaters and not to existing residential wood-heating appliances.

Consumer concern is that the new standards may effectively kill the fireplace and wood stove market, as there may be little or no ability to adhere to new guidelines. Although the standards will not apply to existing wood-heating appliances, the likeliness of wood continuing to be source for heating new homes would likely be reduced or minimized. Formal comments are due by May 5th.

3. **Update: Request for USFS Investigation – Cibola National Forest – Mountainair District.** Mr. Morel formally requested an Investigation into the Mountainair District Ranger's June 11, 2013 decision to ban or modify grazing privileges on the Cibola National Forest on January 22, 2013. **See Enclosure 1.** Manager checked into the status and is awaiting a response from Deputy Gilbert Zepeta. Hope to provide additional information on March 18th.

4. Legislative Update and Capital Outlay.

- a. **Senator Phil Griego** sent correspondence that provided a summary of events and actions during the 2014 legislative session (*see Enclosure 2*):
 - i. Senate unanimously passed a comprehensive budget acceptable to the Governor's office;
 - ii. Lottery scholarships available to our children well into the future;
 - iii. Water projects package for shovel-ready projects fully funded throughout District 39;
 - iv. Right to Farm Bill passes that ensures farmers and ranchers will be able to continue to operate without the constant worry of frivolous lawsuits filed by part-time residents and out-of-state lawyers;
 - v. \$1,100,000 in capital outlay dispersed throughout the district.
- b. **Hubert Quintana**, Executive Director-SNMEDD provided a 2014 SNMEDD Legislative Recap. **See Enclosure 3.** See page 12 of enclosure for Lincoln County Capital Outlay commitments:
 - i. Construct / expand Detention Center \$163,000
 - ii. Construct Expansion of White Oaks VFD \$ 20,000

RE: Request for Investigation into the Mountainair District Ranger's June 11, 2013 decision to ban or modify grazing privileges on the Cibola National Forest

Dear Mr. Joyner:

Please be advised, my name is Alan Morel and I am the attorney for the Board of County Commissioners of Lincoln County. I am writing to you on behalf of the Board of County Commissioners requesting an investigation into the decision of the Mountainair District Ranger to ban or modify grazing privileges within the Cibola National Forest on or about June 11, 2013¹. While the Board of County Commissioners understand that the District Ranger's decision was rescinded by the U.S. Forest Service on or about November 7, 2013, they are still incredibly concerned about restrictions that may be placed on future grazing permits within the Cibola National Forest and elsewhere. The June 11, 2013 decision of the Mountainair District Ranger to ban or modify grazing privileges appears to have been made without any specific scientific data to back the decision. This creates a great deal of concern and uncertainty for grazing permittees.

By way of background, Mountainair District Ranger, Karen L. Lessard, appeared before the Board of County Commissioners of Lincoln County at their regular meeting held on August 13, 2013, at which time a copy of Ms. Lessard's letter dated June 11, 2013 suspending all grazing on the Mountainair Ranger District no later than July 30, 2013 was discussed. District Ranger Lessard attempted to explain her decision to modify existing grazing permits, but did not provide any scientific data to support her conclusions. The Board of County Commissioners of Lincoln County passed and adopted Resolution 2013-13 requesting that the Mountainair District of the U.S. Forest Service reconsider and withdraw their removal order, and instead work with the allotment owners, the New Mexico Department of Agriculture and the Range Improvement Task Force at New Mexico State University to develop drought management plans specific to each allotment. A copy of Resolution 2013-13 Opposing the Blanket Removal of Livestock from the Mountainair District of the Cibola National Forest is attached hereto as Exhibit "B".

The Board of County Commissioners contacted and requested the assistance of the Range Improvement Task Force, a division of the New Mexico Department of Agriculture located at New Mexico State University in Las Cruces, New Mexico. The Range Improvement Task Force prepared an analysis of the condition of the grazing allotments within the Mountainair District and concluded that there were sufficient levels of forage to allow for grazing, which completely contradicted the assessment and decision of District Ranger Lessard. I have attached to this correspondence as Exhibits "C-1 through C-5" five separate analyses performed by the Range Improvement Task Force which set forth their scientific analysis of the condition of the range areas in question which are identified as follows:

- C-1 September 27, 2013 assessment for the grazing allotments of Mr. William Bryan
- C-2 October 30, 2013 assessment for the grazing allotments of Mr. Matthew Aragon
- C-3 October 31, 2013 assessment for the grazing allotments of Mr. Rand Perkins
- C-4 November 18, 2013 assessment for the grazing allotments of Mr. Bob Hudgens
- C-5 November 25, 2013 assessment of the grazing allotments of Mr. Albert "Mike" Sanchez


A quick review of the Range Improvement Task Force assessments of all grazing permit areas analyzed supports the return of livestock on each of the individual permittees grazing allotments. The Board of County Commissioners would like to know why the Range Improvement Task Force was not consulted by the Mountainair District Ranger Lessard prior to implementing her decision on June 11, 2013.

The Board of County Commissioners of Lincoln County commend the decision of the Forest Service to rescind the decision to suspend all grazing on the Mountainair Ranger District as of November 7, 2013. The Board of County Commissioners, once again, remains concerned about the potential restrictions on future grazing permits and permittee's rights based upon the apparent, arbitrary and capricious nature of the decision to suspend grazing rights without any scientific data to support the same. An investigation into this matter is respectfully requested to ensure that decisions in the future which effect grazing permits within not only Lincoln County but the State of New Mexico are based upon sound, scientific data, and not unsupported opinions.

I would like to thank you in advance for your assistance regarding this matter and look forward to working with your office to arrive at a satisfactory resolution of this issue.

For the first time in my seventeen years as a State Senator, the Senate unanimously passed a comprehensive budget that was acceptable to the Governor's Office. Through bi-partisan negotiations and open communications, Senators on both sides of the aisle came together and worked for the constituents we all serve. Additional legislation we passed includes a bill that ensures lottery scholarships will be available to our children well into the future. We passed a water projects package that will fully fund shovel-ready water projects throughout District 39.


Finally, we introduced and are confident that the Right to Farm Bill will pass and ensure that the farmers and ranchers of our state will be able to continue operations without the constant worry of frivolous lawsuits filed by part-time residents and out-of-state lawyers.

On a less positive note, I received over ninety million dollars (\$90,000,000) of capital outlay requests. As always, I am whole-heartedly committed to supporting and representing you and the residents of your community and will continue to push legislation and fight for every dollar available.

2014 SNMEDD LEGISLATIVE RECAP

SOME FAREWELLS ARE IN ORDER

Representatives Donald Bratton and William Gray announced that they will not be seeking re-election to their House of Representatives seats in the upcoming November election.

Representative Bratton (R-Hobbs) has served in the House of Representatives since 2000. Representative Bratton in his tenure in the Legislature served on the House Appropriation and Finance Committee and as the House Minority Leader. Representative Bratton was a great friend of the Lea County communities and the SNMEDD in general. He has been a public servant in our area for more than 22 years. We all appreciate his years of dedication to the region. He will be greatly missed.

Representative William (Bill) Gray (R-Artesia) has served in the Legislature representing Chaves, Eddy and Otero Counties with great zeal. Representative Gray during his tenure served on the House Appropriations and Finance Committee and Tax and Revenue Committee. He has served in the Legislature for 8 years and has worked hard to look after his constituents. We all appreciate his years of dedication to the region. He too will be greatly missed.

Both Representative Bratton and Representative Gray have been outstanding representatives of the oil and gas revenue industry in New Mexico. Both will finish out their terms before stepping down.

SOME ISSUES OF INTEREST FROM THE LEGISLATURE

This year, the Legislature passed a \$6.2 million budget that will provide for salary increases of at least 3% for state teachers and employers. The budget added \$170 million in education funding and shored up the lottery scholarship by diverting the general fund portion of State liquor tax revenues not being used for DWI and other programs.

In healthcare, legislation was passed to provide voluntary certification for community health workers which will produce \$27 million for rural hospitals to take advantage of Medicare match toward an Uncompensated Care Pool and Medicaid Base Rate increases.

The economy should benefit from over \$233 million in capital projects and \$169 million of general obligation bond projects. The Legislature also voted to develop a one-stop business portal, \$15 million in local economic development act projects, and a new matching grant program through the Economic Development Department.

The Governor's year of water also fared well with \$89 million for water projects, as well as Water Trust Board legislation that reorganizes the State's representation and approves many projects.

A LOOK AT KEY LEGISLATION AND SERVICES

The SNMEDD participates and maintains a presence for the entire session, as a service to our members, our Legislators, rural communities, water associations and educational entities. We are here to serve, and below represents a list of some key legislation we followed and when necessary provided input. The SNMEDD does not lobby, but we understand the southeastern New Mexico region and its member communities, making us valuable to Legislators, staff and your hired lobbyists as an information resource.

1. **Coordination of Legislative Forums:** Prior to the Legislative Session the SNMEDD hosted and facilitated Legislative Capital Outlay Hearings in Chaves, Eddy, Lea, Lincoln and Otero Counties.
2. **Capital Outlay Requests and Bill (HB 55):** Southeastern New Mexico Legislators normally have constituents and public entities that need assistance in preparing their Capital Outlay requests contact and receive assistance from the SNMEDD. The District worked closely with all local governments and other constituents in the development of the requests for Legislators. The Capital Outlay Bill (HB 55) passed and a listing of projects by county is attached later in the document.
3. **State Budget Highlights (SB 313):**
 - \$670,200 in funding for State Planning District (COGs)
 - \$3.3 million for County detention of prisoners
 - \$230,000 for Statewide Teen Court

- \$524,400 for food banks
 - \$94 million for safety net care pool payments for hospitals
 - \$10 million for economic development projects pursuant to the Local Economic Development Act (LEDA), an additional \$5 million in Capital Outlay Bill
 - \$500,000 for MainStreet program
 - \$500,000 for the cooperative advertising program in the NM Tourism Department
 - \$1 million for job training incentive program (JTIP)
 - \$75,000 to update regional and state water plans
4. **Hold Harmless” legislation:** All bill related to the “Hold Harmless” matter failed. This leaves the door open for next year and a stronger effort to work out an exemption.
5. **General Obligation Bonds Bill (SB 53):** Passed allowing for many library, higher education, and senior citizen projects in southeastern New Mexico. The bill still needs to be signed by the voters in the upcoming November, 2014 election.
6. **Sole Community Provider and Medicaid Program Bill (SB 268):** The State Health Services Department (HSD) was targeting \$45 million in funding needed locally and at the State level to maximize the Federal Medicaid program. The bill that was passed was a compromise but will provide vital funds for uncompensated care pool and Medicaid base rate increases for rural hospitals. Key legislation components include:
- All counties with the exception of Bernalillo and Sandoval must provide a 1/12 GRT mandatory equivalent;
 - Granting counties up to 1/12 GRT new taxing authority to offset the indigent care programs;
 - Sets a three year sunset, to evaluate this agreement before the Center for Medicaid Services contract period;
 - Adds patient protections and more flexibility for how counties can use its indigent care funds;
 - Matches \$9 million in funding appropriated in SB 313 for HSD, and

- Requests that HSD find the remaining \$9 million needed in their \$1 billion budget, so as not to leave Federal funds on the table.

The New Mexico Association of Counties Lobbying Team provided a concerted effort facilitating various County interests and holding the line.

- 7. Water Trust Board Projects Bill (SB 112):** The Bill as passed and amended in the House. The Bill will re-structure the WTB Oversight Board who ultimately vote on project and funding approvals.
- 8. NMFA Local Government Planning Fund (SB 31):** Passed and approves \$2 million in planning grants to the New Mexico Finance Authority.
- 9. Legislative Support:** Provided assistance to Southeastern New Mexico Legislators to help with constituent issues, capital outlay requests, reauthorizations, policy initiatives and to act as liaison when requested.
- 10. Alternative Fiscal Agent:** The SNMEDD is acting as an alternative fiscal agent for the City of Artesia, City of Jal, City of Lovington, City of Eunice, Eddy County, Lincoln County and Otero County for capital outlay projects funded in 2013 and will extend that service to any other SNMEDD member that will need it on priority projects.



1. **Water Rights Notice.** There is one new water right notice on the State Engineer's website (*See Enclosure 1*).

On January 22, 2014, FNF Construction, Inc. filed application T-6008 for permit to temporarily appropriate underground water within the Tularosa Underground Water Basin in Lincoln County. Applicant proposes using existing well located on land owned by the Malkerson Ranch, LLC for a temporary appropriation of groundwater in an amount tot to exceed 90 acre-feet to be diverted for road construction purposes for NMDOT project no. 2100250 on Highway 54 between mileposts 130 and 146 north of Carrizozo, NM for a period of time not to exceed two years. See Enclosure 2. This is the third notice FNF has filed for the construction on Hwy 54.



What Happens at the Town Hall?




SUBJECT: Status of Lincoln County Subdivision Ordinances

PURPOSE: Discussion of Current Status of Subdivision Development Ordinances

Discussion: On June 7, 2013, the Commission passed Ordinance 2013-03 that established a temporary moratorium on subdivision development within the County of Lincoln. This action was predicated by the recognition that a revised Subdivision Ordinance was necessary to promise responsible development strategies and to ensure orderly development of subdivisions. Of key concern was the limitations of water resources and the effects of allocation, consumption and use on all users of water resources with the County, as well as certain larger geographic and geologic areas, and that it was critical to promote the public safety, health and welfare of its citizens by encouraging water conservation and fair and sensible allocation of existing and future water resources. At the time a permanent Subdivision Ordinance was in the process of being finalized for Commission approval. This Ordinance was effective on June 7, 2013 and expired "after a period of six months or until such time as the County Commission reviewed and repealed this Ordinance, whichever occurred first".

On July 16 2013, the Commission passed the Lincoln County Subdivision Ordinance 2013-02, Amending, Repealing and Reenacting Ordinance 2008-01. Among the changes was Section 17, Water Availability Plan that addressed the water availability concerns that prompted the now-expired temporary moratorium.

SUBJECT: Public Hearing

PURPOSE: Consider the Amendment of Ordinance 2007-2, An Ordinance Prohibiting the Import for Release into the Wild of Certain Genera with Ordinance 2014-2.

Discussion: The Commission and private citizens have been increasingly concerned about the threat that the reintroduction and existence of the wolf in Lincoln County and surrounding counties pose to the County and its inhabitants. It is aware that the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's ("FWS") final rule implementing the introduction of the experimental wolf population allows Mexican Gray Wolves ("wolf") to be "taken" in certain instances. It has scheduled this Public Hearing to address the issue of whether the need exists to establish procedures for the "take" of problem wolves which present imminent danger to humans, including children or other defenseless persons, domestic animals and/or livestock.

Recommendation: After Public Hearing, consider and take action on proposed Ordinance 2014-2.

ORDINANCE NO. 2014-2

AN ORDINANCE SETTING FORTH WOLF-HUMAN PROTECTIVE MEASURES; PROVIDING FOR THE SEVERABILITY OF PARTS HEREOF; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND THE REPEAL OF ORDINANCE NO. 2007-2.

WHEREAS, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (“FWS”) final rule implementing the introduction of the experimental wolf population allows Mexican Gray Wolves (“wolf”) to be “taken” in certain instances. See 63 F.R. 1752, 1759; and

WHEREAS, the FWS, joined by the New Mexico Game and Fish Commission, Arizona Game and Fish Department, the U.S. Forest Service, and others, in a document called *Mexican Wolf Encounter Safety Tips*, states that “if in imminent danger, do what is necessary to protect yourself, your family, or the lives of others;” and

WHEREAS, NMSA 1978, § 4-37-1 provides the power to the county to make and publish ordinances to provide for the health and safety of its inhabitants, and

WHEREAS, NMSA 1978, § 4-37-2 provides that county ordinances are effective within the boundaries of the county, including privately owned land or land owned by the United States; and

WHEREAS, the Lincoln County Commission finds and determines that the existence of the work within the boundaries of Lincoln County, New Mexico, resulting from its introduction elsewhere in New Mexico, is injurious, detrimental and damaging to the County and its inhabitants; and, human interactions with problem wolves have increased within the last twelve months; and, this increase may result in imminent danger to individuals, families and the lives of others’ within the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF LINCOLN COUNTY, NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Procedures are hereby established for the “take” of problem wolves which present imminent danger to humans, including children or other defenseless persons, domestic animals and/or livestock; and

Section 2. Procedures are also established for demanding removal of problem wolves that are habitual causing physical or psychological effects on humans.

Section 3. The Lincoln County Commission, shall petition the FWS for an incidental take statement or to be an authorized person or for a special management plan, to authorize the “take” of wolves.

Section 4. Pursuant to FWS authorization, Section 1 or Section 2 of this ordinance, the Lincoln County Commission shall assume the following actions;

4.1 Upon finding of imminent danger, if action is taken that result in harassment, injury or death of a wolf caused by human action, notify FWS within 24 hours of the incident or if action is taken against a wolf that does not cause death or injury to the animal, notify the FWS within seven days.

4.2 Upon notice of allegation of imminent danger, confirm presence of wolf.

4.3 Identify and document wolf.

4.4 Make an initial observation for obvious physical and/or psychological effects and/or imminent danger on humans, livestock, and/or domestic animals.

Section 5. If evidence of physical effects on human is visible, the Lincoln County Commission shall:

5.1 Identify physical effects to determine if there are injuries or harm.

5.2 Provide comfort and apply first aid.

5.3 Contact EMS and County Sheriff to treat and investigate as necessary.

5.4 Inspect and document physical effects.

5.5 Photograph all scenes where physical effects occurred.

5.6 Measure canine spread in millimeters.

5.7 Take DNA samples.

5.8 Retain clothing for DNA testing and further investigation.

5.9 Document physical effects and harm, after conferring with EMS and/or medical doctor.

5.10 Prepare incident report including all non-confidential information described above and transmit to FWS, and U.S. Wildlife Services within seven days.

Section 6. If evidence of psychological effects on human is present the Lincoln County Commission shall:

6.1 Provide comfort and aid.

6.2 Utilize *Lincoln County Wolf-Human Interactions Complaint Form* to document the incident.

6.3 Submit Complaint Form document to mental health professionals for evaluation.

6.4 If the mental health professional confirms and documents that there are psychological effect, the Lincoln County Commission shall prepare incident report including all non-confidential information and transmit to FWS, and U.S. Wildlife Services within seven days.

Section 7. If evidence of physical and/or psychological effects are present on a human as documented by medical and/or mental health professionals, but, there is no imminent danger to human health or safety, a vote of approval by the Lincoln County Commission, the Commission shall issue a Dispatch Order and demand the immediate removal of the identified wolf from the Mexican Gray Wolf Recovery Program. The Dispatch Order shall be sent to the US Wildlife Services, FWS, New Mexico Department of Game and Fish, and the Mexican Wolf Adaptive Management Oversight Committee (“AMOC”) via phone or email, to be followed up by registered US Postal Service mail with return receipt requested.

Section 8. If evidence of physical effects on humans is not visible, the Lincoln County Commission shall:

8.1 A vote of approval by Lincoln County Commission, the Commission shall issue a Dispatch Order and demand the immediate removal of the wolf identified as habituated from the Mexican Gray Wolf Recovery Program. The Dispatch Order shall be sent to US Wildlife Service, FWS, New Mexico Department of Game and Fish, and AMOC via phone or email, to be followed up by registered US Postal Service mail with return receipt requested.

Section 9 Definitions

Avoidance Response: A form of escape behavior in which the subject evades and aversive event. An avoidance response can be due to anxiety or a frightening situation and is the commonly expected response to negative or aversive events. Related to flight zone, the area surrounding an animal which, when encroached upon, will cause alarm and escape behavior. Wild animals generally have very large flight zones.

Child: As used in the Children’s Code (NMSA 1978 § 32A-1-1) “child” means a person who is less than eighteen years old.

Dispatch Order: Direction issued by the Lincoln County Commission requesting an incidental take permit or other authorization to “take” a wolf within the borders of Lincoln County. The Dispatch Order is the means to request that wolves that cause habitual imminent danger to

individuals, domestic animals or livestock are removed and that the threat and/or harm is eliminated.

Domestic Animal (non-livestock) Attack: Engagement of a wolf in the pursuit of and/or and grasping, biting, attacking, wounding, or feeding upon human-controlled animals which are alive.

Domestic animals are human-controlled, that is, normally within proximity of humans or human-use areas because they are fed, watered and otherwise cared for and their movement is controlled by humans; these include but are not limited to household pets (dogs, cats, etc.), hunting dogs, barnyard poultry, horses and other equines, large birds such as emus and ostriches, 4-H project animals, etc.

Fearless Wolf: A bold-acting wolf which displays no fear of human or human use areas. A wolf that will approach within a close distance of humans. See **Habituated Wolf**.

Food Conditioned Wolf: A wolf which associates people with the presence of food. See **Food Conditioning**.

Food Conditioning: A food-related experience in which a wolf associates humans with a source of food. This initially occurs when a wolf discovers a food source with human scent, sight or sound of humans. A single experience may be all that is necessary for the wolf to become conditioned to associate humans with food. Once wolves have been successful in obtaining human associated foods, absent any negative experience, they may develop new behavior patterns and may continue to see food at human use sites.

Food conditioning can contribute to habituation or habituation can lead to food conditioning, but either may exist in the absence of the other.

Habituated Wolf: A wolf which repeatedly approaches people and/or repeatedly visits human use areas in the presence of people without displaying an avoidance response. Habituated wolves stand, look at people in a fearless manner, and cannot be scared off by yelling, clapping hands, waving arms, throwing objects and/or discharging a firearm.

Habituation is a decreasing response to a repeated, non-consequential stimulus; the loss of a fear response to people which arises from frequent non-consequential encounters.

Human Exposure Evaluation; A component of risk assessment which describes the nature and size of a population exposed to a substance or circumstance, and the magnitude and duration of their exposure. The evaluation may include past exposures, current exposures or anticipated future exposures.

Human Health Risk: the likelihood (or probability) that a given exposure or series of exposures may already have caused or will cause damage to the health of individuals experiencing the exposures.

Human-Wolf Interaction: see Wolf-Human Interaction.

Investigative Approaches: A rapid approach, stop and retreat without threat display made by a wolf; occurs when wolf realizes subject of investigative approach is not prey.

Livestock Attack: Engagement of a wolf in the pursuit of and/or grasping, biting, attacking, wounding, or feeding upon livestock that are alive.

Non-habituated Wolf: A wolf which is wild. Such wolves approach people, then quickly retreat once the humans have been identified.

Problem Wolf: A wolf that:

- Had depredated lawfully present domestic livestock.
- Is a member of a group or pack (including adults, yearlings, and young-of-the-year) that were directly involved in livestock depredations.
- Was fed by or are dependent up adults involved with livestock depredations (because young animals will likely acquire the pack's livestock depredation habits).
- Has depredated domestic animals other than livestock on private or tribal lands, two times in an area within one year, or
- Is habituated to humans, human residences, or other facilities.

50 C.F.R. § 17.84 (k)(15).

Psychological harm or damage: Mental stress, wound, injury, or trauma which may or may not be accompanied by physical damage.

Predation: Orientation towards the prey followed by: stalking, chasing, catching, biting, shaking the prey, carrying or dragging off. May be no prior threat display or vocalization. May continue attack on targeted prey, even with interference. Children are particularly susceptible to wolf predation on humans.

Threat: Any wolf-related circumstance or event with the potential for adverse physical or psychological impact upon a human. A wolf is considered to be a threat to a human any time the wolf demonstrates menacing or fearless behavior while in close proximity to a human. A wolf is considered to be a threat to a human without demonstrating menacing or fearless behavior when that wolf is in close proximity to a child or any human who could not reasonably be expected to be able to protect him/herself.

Wild Wolf: A wolf with wild characteristics; not tame or domesticated. A wild wolf is free ranging exclusively in the wild and has an avoidance response to humans and human use areas.

Wolf-Human Interaction: Any incident in which the behavior of a wolf has a direct physical or mental effect upon a human.

Effective Date and Repeal of Ordinance.

This Ordinance shall take effect thirty days after recording in the Public Records of Lincoln County at which date and time Ordinance No. 2007-2 shall be repealed.

SUBJECT: Lincoln County / Village of Ruidoso Building Permitting Process in the County

PURPOSE: Consider / Action on MOU Between the County and the Village of Ruidoso Regarding Building Permits in the County

Discussion: The County has been working with the Village of Ruidoso for several months on negotiating a Memorandum of Understanding for the Provision of Regulation Services of Residential and Commercial Construction within Certain Specified Areas of the County of Lincoln. **See Enclosure 1** for MOU approved by the Village of Ruidoso at its March 11th meeting. The initial term of this agreement shall be for a period of six months from the date of its execution by the last party signing.

Recommendation: Approve MOU between the County of Lincoln and the Village of Ruidoso for its agreed upon term of six months.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN THE
VILLAGE OF RUIDOSO
AND
THE COUNTY OF LINCOLN

FOR THE PROVISION OF REGULATION SERVICES OF RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL CONSTRUCTION WITHIN CERTAIN SPECIFIED AREAS OF THE COUNTY OF LINCOLN.

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into between the COUNTY OF LINCOLN ("COUNTY") and the VILLAGE OF RUIDOSO ("Ruidoso"). County and Ruidoso are collectively referred to as "the Parties." The common power to be exercised is as set forth in the Agreement.

WHEREAS, the Parties are public agencies, as defined in the Act, and are authorized by law to enter into this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Construction Industries Licensing Act (CILA), NMSA, 1978, § 60-13-44 E, the County has the right of review of all specifications of residential and commercial general construction and the responsibility to ensure compliance with construction standards adopted by the County; and

WHEREAS, Ruidoso is a Municipality as defined in NMSA, 1978, § 12-6-2., and has by ordinance adopted the conditions, provisions, limitations and terms of a building code pursuant to its powers under NMSA, 1978, § 3-18-1; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to NMSA, 1978, § 3-18-6 A. (4) and C. (1), a municipality has jurisdiction over building permits issued by the municipality except with respect to construction specifically exempted by the CILA; and may authorize the investigation of code violations or activities of licensees or others that constitute violations of NMSA 1978, § 60-13-23, 24, or 36; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into this Agreement in order to effectuate administrative efficiency in the regulation of residential and commercial general construction, including mechanical, electrical and plumbing inspections and permits located within the geographical boundaries of the County in those areas designated on exhibit "A" which are incorporated herein by reference as they currently exist or may be modified in the future by agreement of the parties.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT THE REGULATION OF RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL GENERAL CONSTRUCTION LOCATED WITHIN THE GEOGRAPHICAL BOUNDARIES OF

THE COUNTY AND WITHIN THE GEOGRAPHICAL BOUNDARIES SET FORTH ON EXHIBIT "A", WHICH ARE NOT OWNED BY THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO, OR RUIDOSO SHALL BE ACCOMPLISHED AS FOLLOWS:

1. **AUTHORIZATION AND SCOPE.** Ruidoso is hereby granted the authority to regulate residential and commercial construction located within the geographical boundaries of the County in the geographical boundaries set forth on Exhibit "A" as they currently exist or may be modified in the future by agreement of the parties, which are not owned by the State of New Mexico, subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein. Ruidoso will issue, monitor and maintain documents for all construction permits and provide inspection services for said permits. Ruidoso will also provide Building Code Enforcement services subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement within the constraints of applicable law.
2. **PREREQUISITES.**
 - a. Ruidoso shall, at all times relevant to this Agreement, maintain a permitting and inspection program and shall employ full time plan review personnel and electrical, mechanical, plumbing and general construction inspectors who are certified by the International Code Council and the State of New Mexico throughout the term of this Agreement.
 - b. If Ruidoso fails to maintain a permitting and inspection program, or if it fails to replace within four (4) months or one hundred twenty (120) days and employ the requisite inspectors as set forth in this agreement, the County may terminate this agreement by providing and delivering written notice to Ruidoso of termination at least four (4) months or one hundred twenty (120) days prior to the effective date of termination and take such action as is necessary to provide for these services in house or through an agreement with the State of New Mexico.
3. **BUILDING STANDARDS.** The building standards applied by Ruidoso shall be, at the least, the minimum State standards, as required by NMSA, 1978, § 3-17-6 A.
4. **VIOLATION ENFORCEMENT AND MONITORING.** Ruidoso will assist the State with enforcement and provide monitoring of Building Ordinance violations consistent with State Law.
5. **TERM.** The initial term of this agreement shall be for a period of six months, from the date of its execution by the last party signing. During that trial period the parties shall regularly communicate concerning the performance of the services contemplated herein and shall jointly monitor permitting fees, inspection performance time frames, and any other issues or performance standards contained on exhibit "B" which is attached hereto and is incorporated herein by

reference. Thereafter, in the event the parties determine to continue with this agreement it shall continue until terminated pursuant to the terms hereof or by operation of law.

6. **TERMINATION.** This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon delivery of written notice to the other at least four (4) months or one hundred twenty (120) days prior to the effective date of termination. By such termination, neither party may nullify or void any obligation required to have been performed prior to the effective date of termination.
7. **SUBCONTRACTING AND ASSIGNMENT.** Ruidoso may not subcontract any portion of the services to be performed by it pursuant to this Agreement, assign this Agreement, or obligate itself in any manner to any third party with respect to any rights or responsibilities under this Agreement, without prior written consent of the County.
8. **RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS.** Ruidoso shall account for receipts and disbursements relating hereto and shall make all relevant financial records available to the County upon request, and shall maintain all related records in accordance with state records retention policies after this Agreement has expired or has been terminated.
9. **AMENDMENT.** This Agreement may not be altered, changed, or amended except by instrument in writing executed by the parties hereto and approved by the Secretary of the New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration.
10. **WAIVER.** No waiver of any breach or term or condition of this Agreement shall constitute a waiver of any other term or condition of this Agreement, or a subsequent waiver of the same breach or term or condition. No waiver of any term or condition of this Agreement shall be valid or binding unless in writing and signed by the party alleged to have granted the waiver.
11. **GOVERNING LAW.** This agreement and the interpretation hereof shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Mexico pertaining to such agreements. The District Court of the Twelfth Judicial District within and for Lincoln County shall be the court of venue for resolution of any disputes that arise pursuant to this agreement.
12. **MERGER OF PRIOR AGREEMENTS.** This Agreement incorporates all of the conditions, agreements and understandings between the parties concerning the subject matter hereof, and all such conditions, agreements and understandings have been merged into this Agreement. No prior condition, agreement, or understanding, verbal or otherwise, of the parties or their agents shall be valid or enforceable unless embodied in this Agreement.
13. **HOLD HARMLESS.** Neither party shall be responsible for liability incurred as a result of the other party's acts or omissions in connection with this Agreement.

Any liability incurred in connection with this Agreement is subject to the immunities and limitations of the New Mexico Tort Claims Act. Nothing contained in this Agreement should be construed as a waiver of the protections afforded to local governments under the New Mexico Tort Claims Act.

14. **APPROPRIATIONS.** The terms of this Agreement are contingent upon sufficient appropriations and authorization being made by the Village Council for the performance of this Agreement.
15. **ANALYSIS AND REPORTING OF FEES COLLECTED.** For a period of six months from the date of signing of this Agreement, the parties agree that the Village of Ruidoso shall provide a report to the County of Lincoln at a minimum of a quarterly basis which will identify the building permits issued, the fees charged, a cost comparison of fees charged with the cost of providing said services, and the location of the services rendered: i.e. within the municipal limits of the Village of Ruidoso or in the County. Once the data identified herein has been collected for a period of not less than six months, the parties will utilize the data to determine whether or not a portion of the fees collected by the Village of Ruidoso should be paid over to the County of Lincoln.



FOR INSPECTIONS AND PERMITTING IN
LINCOLN COUNTY

1. The fee schedule for inspections and permitting pursuant to this Memorandum of Understanding is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The Parties hereby agree that the fee for inspections to be charged County residents shall be the same as those charged Ruidoso.
2. Requests to schedule inspections shall be telephoned to an automated inspection request phone number. The permit holder shall provide all information required by the inspector when requesting an inspection to be scheduled. Requests will be processed the next business day and will be scheduled as work load and staff availability permit. Every effort will be made to schedule and complete inspections within one (1) to two (2) business days.
3. When an applicant appears for a building permit, or downloads an application on line, the applicant shall be provided with an application form which shall include a space for County approval. The applicant shall be instructed to take the application form to the County Annex building for review. After insuring that all County requirements are fulfilled, the County shall approve the application form and the applicant shall be instructed to return to Village Hall to complete the application and pay the applicable fee.
4. The County review shall include at least the following elements:
 - A. Flood plain documentation, certification and approval where necessary;
 - B. Driveway cut approval (contingent on payment of the required fee and inspection by the Road Department);
 - C. Registration/sign up with Greentree Solid Waste Authority for solid waste collection for both household collection and construction debris where applicable;
 - D. Address issued by County Rural Addressing.

BUILDINGS (Chapter 22)

Permit and inspection fees (22-34): After consultation with the village manager, the building official may waive permit fees as authorized in the building code.

Building permit fees:

(1) Permit fees are assessed based on a formula that takes into account that the level of effort for a larger, more complex project is not directly proportional to the value of construction (22-34(b)).

The minimum fee is 50.00 up to a construction value of 2,000.00

For construction values from 2,001.00 through 100,000.00 fees are computed and tabulated in 1,000.00 increments. The fee for construction values from 100,001.00 through 500,000.00 is 795.00 plus 4.48 per 1,000.00 over 100,000.00. The fee for construction values from 500,001.00 through 1,000,000.00 is 2,587.00 plus 3.80 per 1,000.00 over 500,000.00. The fee for construction values over 1,000,000.00 is 4,487.00 plus 2.92 per 1,000.00 over 1,000,000.00.

(2) The building official shall issue in January of each year a valuation worksheet for use during the calendar year.
